

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Sussex, holden at Brighton. In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against Albert Vine, of No. 173, Ditchling-rise, and Brigden-street, both in Brighton, in the county of Sussex, Builder.

UPON the hearing of this Petition this day, and upon proof satisfactory to the Court of the debt of the Petitioner, and of the trading, and of the act or acts of the Bankruptcy alleged to have been committed by the said Albert Vine having been given, it is ordered that the said Albert Vine be, and he is hereby, adjudged bankrupt.—Given under the Seal of the Court this 30th day of August, 1879.
