From the rock, as stated by Mr. J. R. Haws, Master of the "Canon Harrison":—Hammond Rock bears N.E. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E.; Ipihi Reef, E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.; Goode Island, south-west extreme, S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.; and White Rocks, N.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W.

These bearings place the rock in lat. $10^{\circ} 32' 35''$ S., long. $142^{\circ} 8' 10''$ E.
