THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious

Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

2. The following area declared, by Order of Council dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, to be an area infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),— An area comprising those portions of the first and second wards of the burgh of Kirkcaldy, in the county of Fife, as defined by The Kirkcaldy Burgh and Harbour Act, 1876, situate south of the line of the North British Railway,—is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

The several declarations described in the Schedule to this Order, made and signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Oxford declaring the existence of foot-and-mouth disease at the several places mentioned, are hereby cancelled, and the infected places thereby declared shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be places infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
