(PORT OF BRISTOL.)

A T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 17th day of September, 1879.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Bristol, in the county of Gloucester, as a foreign animals wharf;

All that space within the city and county of Bristol, situate near the Cumberland Tidal Basin, commencing at a point at the water edge of the north side of the New Junction Lock ninety-three feet from the north-east corner of the said Lock, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of thirty-two feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a westerly direction for a distance of eighty feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a northerly direction for a distance of seventy-five feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in an easterly direction for a distance of thirty-three feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wall, thence at a right angle in a northerly direction for a distance of two hundred and thirty feet or thereabouts and bounded by the eastern side of a building called the Lairs and by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a westerly direction for a distance of one hundred and forty-eight feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wall, thence in a generally southerly direction for a distance of two hundred and forty feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wall and by the western wall of another building called the Lairs and by a wall, thence at a right angle in an easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and forty-six feet or thereabouts and bounded by the south wall of a building called the Slaughter-houses, thence at a right angle in a southerly direction for a distance of seventy-five feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a westerly direction for a distance of eighty feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a southerly direction for a distance of thirty-two feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in an easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and seventy-five feet or thereabouts and bounded by the north wall of the said New Junction Lock to the point aforesaid, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the Bristol Docks deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Bristol.
