Richmond Union.—Parish of Barnes.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Barnes, in the county of Surrey.

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Barnes, in the county of Surrey, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held at the Vestry Room, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Tuesday, the 15th day of April, 1879, it was resolved,—

"That the Local Government Board be requested to issue an Order under their Seal of Office, directing that the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850 (13 and 14 Vict., c. 57), entitled 'An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks,' shall be applied to and put in force within this parish, as regards that portion of it which relates to the providing of accommodation for holding 'Vestry Meetings.'"

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above resolution:

Now, therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us, by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intitled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other Meetings, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Barnes.

ARTICLE II.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish.
