THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Proclamation of the Governor of Louisiana, United States, which provides that, from and after the 1st instant, "all vessels arriving from ports not known to be infected, and not having touched at an infected port, reaching the quarantine station with clean bills of health, having had no sickness on board during the voyage and in a healthy condition, shall be allowed to proceed to the city of New Orleans without detention therefore."
