1. *Bye-laws, extent of.*

The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the

Preston Tramways Company within the said district.

2. *Speed of Carriages.*

No carriages shall be driven at a less rate than five miles nor more than eight miles in the hour upon the average.

3. *Distance from other Carriages.*

No carriage shall be driven so as to follow a preceding carriage at a less distance than thirty yards along any portion of the line of tramway, except when within any siding.

4. *Stopping for Passengers.*

Every driver and conductor of a carriage shall stop the same when required so to do upon any part of the tramway line, by any passenger desirous of leaving the carriage, or by any person desirous of travelling by the carriage, and for whom there is room.

5. *Penalty.*

Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of the above Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence.

6. *Copy of Bye-laws.*

The conductor of each carriage shall carry with him a copy of these Bye-laws, and shall, on request of any passenger, produce the same to, and shall permit the same to be perused by, such passenger; and the said Company shall affix and keep affixed in their offices and waiting rooms within the district a printed copy of the same for the use of the public.

These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1880.
