THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies a copy of a Notice issued by the Governor of Sierra Leone, which provides that in consequence of yellow fever having broken out at Binty, on the Mellicourie River, all vessels arriving at any part of the British possessions in the West Africa Settlements from Binty or places in free communication therewith, are to be subjected to 21 days' quarantine.
