By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eleventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

2. So much of the area declared, by Order of Council dated the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease as is in the petty sessional division of Newmarket, in the county of Cambridge, and also the detached portion of the petty sessional division of Wickhambrook, in the county of Suffolk, which is surrounded by the county of Cambridge, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that portion of that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area or part of an area infected with foot-andmouth disease.

3. The rest of the area comprised in the said Order (namely)—the whole of the petty sessional division of Bottisham, in the county of Cambridge, shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, wherein the following place being a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease is situate (namely):

Certain premises in the occupation of William and Charles Collett, and situate at Quy Mill, in the parish of Stow-cum-Quy, in the county of Cambridge.
