GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board amending Regulations with respect to the Duties of Officers in District Schools.

To the Boards of Management of the several School Districts named in the Schedule to this Order;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain Orders, addressed by the Poor Law Commissioners, the Poor Law Board, and the Local Government Board, respectively, to the Board of Management of each of School Districts named in the Schedule to this this Order, regulations are prescribed with reference to the duties of Officers appointed by such Board of Management;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows with respect to each of the School Districts named in the Schedule to this Order;

ARTICLE 1.—In every case not otherwise provided for by the Orders in force in the School District, every Officer appointed by the Board of Management shall perform his duties in person, and shall not intrust the same to a deputy, except with the special permission of the Local Government Board on the application of the Board of

ARTICLE 2.—Every Medical Officer shall be bound to visit and attend personally, as far as | twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty,
