On the 4th Instant the Duke of Duras appeared with the French Forces under his Com-mand in light of this place, but did not attack us till the 7th, which happened very luckily for us; for our Garifon which was before but see Men, was in the mean time reinforced by the Regiment of Wirtemberg, which feato-nable Affistance put us in a condition to beat off the Enemy, who were already entred into our Suburbs; we had 12 Men willed and divers wounded : and of the French there were who were already entred into our Schurbs; we had 12 Men killed, and divers wounded; and of the French, there were about 350 flain. They thereupon marched back towards *Philipsboarg*, burning in sheir way Witelach, Sintzheim, and fone other places. General Danewalt is come with 6000 Imperial Horfe to Bengheim, and it's believed, he will joyn with the Bavarian Forces, commanded by Count Serini.

From the Imperial Camp before Mentz, Aug. 12. On the 1 oth Instant we finished on the fide of the Imperial Attack the Redoubts against the Counterfcarp ; and the Bavarians and Saxons at the fame time advanced their Trenches towards the Garden of Stadian. There were that night above 20 Men killed and wounded at both attacks. The Imperialists have for several days played upon the Town with 25 Pieces of Cannon, which have almost ruin'd two Bastions; and ye-fterday they began two new Batteries, one of 7, and the other of 16 Guns. At the Bava-rian attack the have planted 6 Pieces of Can-non on two Exteries, and in a day or two they

will have finished their great Battery. A Deferter that came out of the Fown yesterday informed us, That it was not Monfieur de la Bretasche, bur the Marquis de Barbastures, with two other Officers that got into the place forme days ago; and that they had in the Town a great many fick and wounded. This morning the Enemy made a fally with 400 Men upon the Saxons, and possefield themselves of a Redoubt, our Men were cafting up near the head of the Trenches, where they began to intrench themfelves; but Major General Reta, who commanded in the Trenches, haftning to the affiftance of our advanced Guards, the French were beaten back into the Town in great confusions having loft the Officer that commanded them, with many of their Men; and on our fide Major-General Reus was wounded, and Golones Schweinitz and feveral other Officers, with a confiderable number of Soldiers, were killed. The Duke of Lorraine, and the Electors of Bavaria and Saxony are every night in the Trenches.

Francfort, August 14. The Duke of Duras having been repulled in the attempt he made upon Heydelberg, was, according to our laft advice, marching back, in order to repair the

advice, marching back, in order to repais the Rhine, having burnt 10 or 12 Villages. Trier, August 12. The Marquis de Bouffers, who had layn 3 days with the French Troops under his Com-mand near Echternach in the Durchy of Luxemburg, de-camped the 6th Inftant by break of day, and advancing unexpectedly this way, arrived here about Noom with 1800 Horfe and Dragoons, and a great many Wagons la-den with Baggage and Provisions. The 7th he received Orders by an Express from the French Court; whereupon he marched the fame day by the way of Bidlich towards Mont-royal, having fent back greates for the Baggage to Gravemackeren, and is now encamped at Lincamp and Monzenfelt, not far from Berncaffel, where he hath been to Gravemackeren, and is now encamped at Loncamp and Monzenfelt, not far from Berncaffel, where he hath been joyned by feveral Regiments from Mont-royal. Thefe Troops have defiroyed all the Country in their march, burning the Hay and Corn which they could not confume themfelves, plundering the Villages, Gree They pretend to lay a Bridge over the Mofalle. Cologne, August 16.
