

the same pieces or parcels of land or ground are more particularly delineated in the plan drawn in the margin of the said deed subject nevertheless to the several indentures of lease the particulars whereof and the yearly rents amounting together to the sum of eighty-seven pounds sixteen shillings and seven pence or thereabouts which are reserved thereby are set forth in the schedule appended to such deed the said yearly rents so reserved as aforesaid to be to the use of the said minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish for ever.

"And whereas for the purpose of providing a further endowment for the said proposed district the said Thomas Greenhalgh has purchased a sum of three hundred and six pounds four pounds per centum debenture stock of the Great Northern Railway Company and has caused the same sum to be transferred into our name in the books of the said Company in order that the said sum may be held in trust by us as and for a permanent endowment for the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish and the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of stock to be receivable by the said minister or incumbent for the time being when he shall have been duly licensed as aforesaid.

"And whereas the said pieces or parcels of land or ground with the messuages and buildings thereon erected together with the annual rents reserved thereon have been so given granted and conveyed as aforesaid and the said sum of debenture stock of the Great Northern Railway Company has been so provided as aforesaid upon the understanding that we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England should out of our common fund created by the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act pay to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as aforesaid a grant of fifty pounds per annum and upon the further understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas we have agreed and undertaken to make such grant of fifty pounds per annum as aforesaid by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said district chapelry of Saint James Bolton-le-Moors which is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Souls Bolton-le-Moors.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and when the said district shall

have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and become absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised jointly by the said Thomas Greenhalgh by Thomas Lever Rush-ton, of Moor Platt Horwich in the said county of Lancaster Esquire, by Thomas Thwaites, of Bank House Sharples in the said county Esquire by George Hesketh of Seymour-road Astley Bridge in the same county Esquire and Henry Murton of Birkdale Southport in the same county Esquire their heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Souls Bolton-le-Moors being:—

"All that part of the district chapelry of Saint James Bolton-le-Moors within the original limits of the parish of Bolton-le-Moors in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester which is bounded on the east by the new parish of Tonge on the north by the new parish of Astley Bridge all within the original limits of the the said parish of Bolton-le-Moors on the west by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Thomas Halliwell within the original limits of the parish of Deane in the county and diocese aforesaid on the south-west by the new parish of Saint Matthew Bolton-le-Moors also within the original limits of the parish of Bolton-le-Moors aforesaid and upon the remaining sides that is to say on the south-east and on the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Matthew Bolton-le-Moors from the district chapelry of Saint James Bolton-le-Moors aforesaid at the point where Halliwell-road is joined by Draycott-street and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of about thirteen chains (thereby crossing Blackburn-road) to the junction of Draycott-street aforesaid with Latham-street and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nearly one chain to its junction with Charles Rupert-street and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Harcastle-street and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chalfont-street and with the public footpath leading past the northern and eastern sides of Back-o'-th'-Bank Houses to the River Tonge and extending thence first eastward then south-eastward and then again eastward along the middle of the said public footpath for a distance of twelve and a half chains or thereabouts to the boundary on the western side of the said river which boundary divides the said district chapelry of Saint James Bolton-le-Moors from the new parish of Tonge aforesaid."
