The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the "Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning "the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-ground or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention

to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with certain specified modifications:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the twenty-eighth day of October last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twelfth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parishes, without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued as follows, viz. :—

SHOTWICK.—Forthwith wholly in the Primitive Methodist Burial-ground, at Great Saughall, Shotwick, except so far as is compatible with the observance of the regulations for new burial-grounds.

CONGRESBURY.—Forthwith wholly in the parish church of Congresbury, in the county of Somerset; and in the churchyard, except in walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except in earthen graves which can be opened without the disturbance of offensive soil or of undecayed remains.

BEDMINSTER.—Forthwith wholly in the parish church of Saint Paul's, Bedminster, Bristol; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

WOLLATON.—Forthwith wholly in Wollaton Church, in the county of Nottingham; and in the churchyard, except in existing vaults, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

ABERGELE.—Forthwith wholly in the parish church of Abergele, in the county of Denbigh; and in the churchyard after the thirtieth of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, except in now existing vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except in earthen graves which can be opened without the exposure of coffins or of undecayed remains.

BURTON JOYCE.—Forthwith wholly in the parish church of Burton Joyce, in the county of Nottingham; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except in earthen graves which can be opened without the exposure of coffins or of undecayed remains.

FOREST ROW, EAST GRINSTEAD.—Forthwith wholly in Bethesda Chapel and chapelyard, Forest Row, in the parish of East Grinstead, in the county of Sussex.

PENDLETON.—Forthwith wholly in the burial-ground of the Brunswick Wesleyan Chapel, Pendleton, in the parish of Eccles, in the county of Lancaster.

SYSTON.—Forthwith wholly in the parish church of Syston, in the county of Leicester; and in the churchyard, except in existing vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except in earthen graves which can be opened without the exposure of coffins to the depth of four feet.

HOLY TRINITY, MAIDSTONE.—Forthwith wholly in the burial-ground adjoining Holy Trinity Church, Maidstone, in the county of Kent, except in now existing vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

TAXAL.—In the burial-ground adjoining the Spring Bank Chapel, Whaley Bridge, in the county of Chester, except in existing family graves which can be opened without the exposure of coffins.

GATE HELMSLEY.—Forthwith in the old part of Gate Helmsley Churchyard, in the county of York, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

LLANGADOCK.—Forthwith wholly in Llangadock Vawr Church, in the county of Carmarthen; and in the churchyard after the thirty-first of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, except in now existing vaults and walled graves which are free from water, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except in earthen graves which are free from water, for the burial of the widowers, widows, and unmarried children of those already buried therein.

WARTHILL.—Forthwith wholly in the old part of Warthill Churchyard, in the county of York.

BONCHURCH, ISLE OF WIGHT.—Forthwith wholly in the old parish church of Bonchurch, Isle of Wight, in the county of Hants; and in the churchyard, except in existing family vaults and graves.

BURGHCLERE.—Forthwith wholly in the parish church of All Saints, Burghclere, in the

county of Hants; and in the churchyard, except in existing vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented. *C. L. Peel.*

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent Notices in the London Gazette), respecting open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant Superintendent of Furniture in the Office of Her Majesty's Works, &c.

N.B.—*These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.*

I. The Examination will consist of two parts, and will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

PART I.—*Preliminary.*

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. Arithmetic (to Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).

NOTE.—Candidates will be required to show what preliminary training or technical education they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situation of this nature, and they must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners on this point before they can be admitted to the competition.

* * * No Candidate who fails to show satisfactory proficiency in any of the subjects specified above will be admitted to the competitive part of the Examination.

PART II.—*Competitive.*

1. Knowledge of furniture, fittings, &c.
(Candidates must be competent practically to superintend the supply and repairs of all articles of furniture and fittings, &c., which may possibly be required in public buildings and royal palaces.)
2. Estimating.
(They must be able to frame estimates of the probable cost of such supply and repairs.)
3. Drawing.

(They must be competent to prepare working drawings and sketches showing the design and construction of all articles of furniture, of bookcases, presses, cupboards, and other fittings.)

The competition will be decided partly by the number of marks given for answers, written or oral, to questions on the above-mentioned subjects, and partly by such

testimony as the Commissioners may obtain from persons of practical experience as to the relative fitness of the Candidates.

III. No Candidate will be eligible whose age on the first day of the Competitive Examination is less than 25 or more than 35.
