Runcorn Union.—Township of Runcorn.
To the Overseers of the Poor of the Township of Runcorn, in the County of Chester;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the said township of Runcorn, according to the census, exceeds two thousand persons;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said township, held at the Overseers' Offices, Runcorn, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the 9th day of October, 1879, it was resolved,—

“That the Poor Law Board be requested to issue an Order under their Seal of Office, directing that the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850 (13 and 14 Vict., c. 57), entitled ‘An Act to prevent the holding of ‘Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, ‘and for regulating the appointment of ‘Vestry Clerks,’ shall be applied to and put in force within this township, as regards the providing of accommodation for holding ‘Vestry Meetings.’”

And whereas the Overseers of the Poor of the said township have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above resolution :

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows :

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of “Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for “regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other Meetings, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said township of Runcorn.
