**O**RDERS for the Court's going into Mourning on Sunday next, the 18th instant, for His late Serene Highness The Duke of Schleswig-Holstein-Sonderberg-Augustenberg, Cousin of The Queen, and Brother of His Royal Highness The Prince Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, K.G.; Her Majesty's Son-in-Law; viz. :—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, white Gloves, black or white Shoes, Feathers, and Fans, Pearls, Diamonds, or plain gold or silver Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to wear black Court Dress, with black Swords and Buckles.

The Court to change the Mourning on Wednesday, the 21st instant, viz. :—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, with coloured Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments, or grey or white Dresses, with black Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to continue the same Mourning.

And on Sunday, the 25th instant, the Court to go out of Mourning.
