Buckingham Palace, February 5, 1880.

THIS day Her Majesty proceeded in state from Buckingham Palace to the House of Peers, where she arrived soon after two o'clock; and was received on alighting from Her state carriage, by the Lord Chancellor, the Deputy Lord Great Chamberlain (Lord Aveland), Garter King of Arms, and Black Rod, and proceeded into the House in the usual order;—The Crown was borne by the Duke of Northumberland (Lord Privy Seal), the Sword of State by the Duke of Richmond and Gordon (Lord President of the Council), and the Cap of Maintenance by the Marquess of Winchester.

Her Majesty being seated on the Throne, and the Great Officers of State and others standing in their respective places on the right and left, Black Rod was sent with a message from Her Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their immediate attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, Her Majesty was pleased to deliver to the Lord Chancellor the following most gracious Speech to both Houses of Parliament, which Her Majesty commanded his Lordship to read, and which he accordingly did:

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

It is with much satisfaction that I again resort to the advice and assistance of my Parliament.

My relations with all the Powers continue to be friendly. The course of events since the prorogation of Parliament has tended to furnish additional security to the maintenance of European peace, on the principles laid down by the Treaty of Berlin. Much, however, still remains to be done to repair the disorder with which the late war has affected many parts of the Turkish Empire.

A Convention for the suppression of the Slave Trade has been concluded between my Government and that of His Imperial Majesty the Sultan.

At the close of your last Session I expressed my hope that the Treaty of Gundamak had happily terminated the war in Afghanistan. In conformity with its provisions, my Envoy, with his retinue, was honourably received and entertained by the Ameer at Cabul. While engaged, however, in the exercise of their duty, he and those connected with the Embassy were treacherously attacked by overwhelming numbers, and, after an heroic defence, were almost all massacred. An outrage so intolerable called for condign chastisement, and my troops, which, pursuant to the stipulations of the Treaty, either had withdrawn or were withdrawing from the terri-

tories governed by the Ameer, were ordered to retrace their steps. The skill exhibited in the rapid march upon Cabul, and in the advances upon the other lines of action, reflects the highest credit upon the officers and men of my British and native forces, whose bravery has shone with its wonted lustre in every collision with the enemy.

The abdication of the Ameer and the unsettled condition of the country render the recall of my troops impossible for the present; but the principle on which my Government has hitherto acted remains unchanged, and, while determined to make the frontiers of my Indian Empire strong, I desire to be in friendly relations alike with those who may rule in Afghanistan and with the people of that country.

My anticipations as to the early establishment of peace in South Africa have been fulfilled. The capture and deposition of the Zulu King, and the breaking up of the military organization on which his dynasty was based, have relieved my possessions in that part of the world from a danger which has seriously impeded their advancement and consolidation. In Basutoland, a native outbreak of considerable importance has been effectually quelled by my Colonial forces; while the Transvaal has been freed from the depredations of a powerful Chief, who, having successfully resisted the former government of the country, had persistently rejected our attempts at conciliation. I have reason to hope that the time is now approaching when an important advance may be made towards the establishment of a Union or Confederation under which the powers of self-government, already enjoyed by the inhabitants of the Cape Colony, may be extended to my subjects in other parts of South Africa.

Papers on these and other matters will be forthwith laid before you.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I have directed the Estimates of this year to be prepared and presented to you without delay.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

The Commission which, at the close of the Session, I informed you I had issued to inquire into the causes of agricultural depression throughout the United Kingdom, is pursuing its labours. In the meantime, the serious deficiency in the usual crops in some parts of Ireland has rendered necessary special precautions on the part of my Government to guard against the calamities with which those districts were threatened.

With this view, they have called upon the authorities charged with the duty of administering

relief to make ample preparations for the distribution of food and fuel, should such a step become necessary, and they have also stimulated the employment of labour by advances on terms more liberal than those prescribed by the existing law.

I feel assured that you will give your sanction to the course which has been adopted where it may have exceeded the power entrusted by Parliament to the Executive Government.

A proposal will be submitted to you for providing the funds required for these exceptional advances on the security of the property administered by the Church Temporalities Commissioners.

I trust you will be able to resume the consideration of the Criminal Code, and of the Improvement of the Law of Bankruptcy.

Bills will be laid before you, for enlarging the powers of owners of Settled Land, for consolidating and amending the Lunacy Laws, and for simplifying the practice of Conveyancing.

I commend to you these and other measures which may be submitted for your consideration, and I trust that the blessing of the Almighty will attend and direct your labours.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty,

chapter thirty-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four, and of the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and sixty duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventh day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and four of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four and of the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and sixty have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Saint Luke New Kentish Town out of the parish of Kentish Town and out of the parish of the Holy Trinity Haverstock Hill which said three parishes are all within the original limits of the parish of Saint Pancras in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

“Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Saint Luke New Kentish Town of the said parish of Kentish Town and of the said parish of the Holy Trinity Haverstock Hill which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner hereinafter set forth.

“And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

“And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish of Saint Pancras have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein mentioned Acts or of some of them and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act to the minister of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted so soon as one shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors a grant of two hundred pounds per annum and also so soon as a church shall have been erected within and for such district and shall have been approved by us and shall have been consecrated as the church of such district and such district shall have thereupon become a new parish within the meaning of the secondly herein mentioned Act to make and pay such further grant from the said fund as will suffice to raise the income of the incumbent of the said new parish to three hundred pounds per annum.

“And whereas such grants as aforesaid will be made by an instrument or instruments to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend John Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof

he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Saint Luke New Kentish Town, of the said parish of Kentish Town, and of the said parish of the Holy Trinity Haverstock Hill which are mentioned and described in the schedule hereunder written and which are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘The District of Saint Barnabas Kentish Town.’

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“The District of Saint Barnabas Kentish Town, being:—

“All those several contiguous portions of the parish of Saint Luke New Kentish Town, of the parish of Kentish Town and of the parish of the Holy Trinity Haverstock Hill, all within the original limits of the parish of Saint Pancras in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, which said portions are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of the Holy Trinity Haverstock Hill from the parish of Saint Luke New Kentish Town aforesaid, at the point where Prince of Wales-road joins Kentish Town-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-four and a quarter chains or thereabouts (thereby following in one part the last-described boundary and in another part the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Luke New Kentish Town from the parish of Kentish Town aforesaid) to a point opposite to the Kentish Town Station on the line of the Midland Railway immediately over the middle of the main line of the said railway, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said main line of railway for a distance of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to the point where it passes under the middle of the line of the Hampstead Junction Railway such point being upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Kentish Town from the parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town within the original limits of the parish of Saint Pancras aforesaid and extending thence, that is from the last-described point, southward along the middle of the line of the said Hampstead Junction Railway for a distance of thirty-six chains or thereabouts (thereby following in part the last-described boundary and in part the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town from the parish of the Holy Trinity Haverstock Hill aforesaid, and passing through the Kentish Town Station on the last-named line of railway to the centre of the bridge which carries the same line of railway over Prince of Wales-road aforesaid and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the first-described point at the junction of the same road with Kentish Town-road aforesaid, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of the

Holy Trinity Haverstock Hill from the parish of Saint Luke New Kentish Town aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the three parishes out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the new parish of Saint Mary Sheffield and out of the new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall both within the original limits of the parish of Sheffield in the county of York and in the diocese of York.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said new parish of Saint Mary Sheffield and of the said new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas by a certain deed or indenture bearing date on or about the twenty-ninth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and made or expressed to be made under the provisions of 'The New Parishes Acts 1843, 1844 and 1856' or some or one of them between Thomas Gould of Sheffield

aforesaid Gentleman of the first part Ellen Maria Gould of Burwash in the county of Sussex Spinster of the second part Thomas Steade of Sheffield aforesaid Ironfounder of the third part Henry Wilson of Westbrook near Sheffield aforesaid Esquire of the fourth part George Pringle, of No. 10 Whitehall-place in the county of Middlesex Esquire of the fifth part and us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the sixth part (which deed or indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of your Majesty's High Court of Justice) the said Thomas Gould did with the consent and by the direction of the said Henry Wilson and at the request and with the concurrence of the said Ellen Maria Gould and of the said Thomas Steade and in consideration of the sum of two thousand two hundred and eighty-six pounds sterling paid by the said Henry Wilson grant and release unto the said George Pringle and his heirs certain pieces or parcels of land situate in Albany-road in the said parish of Sheffield which same pieces or parcels of land are more particularly described in the first schedule of the said deed or indenture together with the messuages or tenements and buildings erected and built upon the said pieces or parcels of land subject nevertheless to the several indentures of lease the particulars of which are set forth in the same schedule but with the benefit of the several reserved rents amounting in gross to the sum of one hundred and one pounds twelve shillings per annum payable under or by virtue of the said leases, to have and to hold the said several pieces or parcels of land with the messuages or tenements and buildings thereon erected or built as aforesaid unto the said George Pringle and his heirs to the use of the said Henry Wilson and his heirs and assigns until a minister shall have been appointed and licensed to the said district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and when and so soon as such minister shall have been appointed and licensed then to the use of the minister of the said district and his successors ministers thereof or as the case may be incumbents of the new parish (when the same district shall under the provisions of the hereinnamed Acts have become a new parish) for the time being for ever.

"And whereas the said pieces or parcels of land with the messuages or tenements and buildings thereon were so granted and released as aforesaid upon the understanding that we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England should out of our common fund created by the hereinbefore firstly mentioned act pay to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as aforesaid a grant of fifty pounds per annum and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas we have agreed and undertaken to make such grant of fifty pounds per annum as aforesaid by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of

the said new parish of Saint Mary Sheffield and of the said new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall which are described in the schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Matthias Sheffield.'

And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district and so soon as the same district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of such new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry Wilson his heirs and assigns for ever.

And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Matthias Sheffield being:—

"All that portion of the new parish of Saint Mary Sheffield and also all that contiguous portion of the new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall both within the original limits of the parish of Sheffield in the county of York and in the diocese of York which said portions of such new parishes are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point over the stream called or known as Porter Brook where the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall of the said new parish of Saint Mary Sheffield of the consolidated chapelry of Saint Simon Sheffield within the original limits of the said parish of Sheffield and of the new parish of Gillicar also within the original limits of the parish of Sheffield aforesaid all meet at which point the streets or roads called or known respectively as South-street Moor London-road Cemetery-road and Ecclesall New-road all join and extending thence that is from the said point of junction first westward and then north-westward along the boundary which divides the said new parish of Gillicar from the new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall aforesaid for a distance of thirty-one chains or thereabouts thereby following the course of Ecclesall New-road aforesaid and of William-street to the junction of the last-named street with Broomhall-street and with Broomhall-road and extending thence that is from the last-mentioned boundary south-westward along the middle of the said Broomhall-road for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Victoria-road and extending thence first southward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Collegiate-crescent-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of five and a-half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ecclesall New-road

HER Majesty has been pleased by Her Order in Council of the 4th February instant, to grant to Josiah Vavasseur, of Southwark, in the county of Surrey, Engineer, a prolongation for the term of five years of certain Letters Patent for the invention of "improvements in projectiles for breech-loading rifles," such Letters Patent having

Great Bank of Newfoundland.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 136, of 13th September, 1879, on an examination of the Great Bank of Newfoundland in the vicinity of Virgin Rocks, made by Staff-Commander Maxwell, Admiralty Surveyor :—

The following further information, resulting from that examination, has been received, as also the position assigned by that officer to the Virgin Rocks :—

VIRGIN ROCKS.—The bank with depths of 9 to 20 fathoms on which these rocks are situated occupies a space 6 miles long in a N.N.E. and

S.S.W. direction and one mile broad. The least depth found on the Virgin Rocks was 3 fathoms, over a small pinnacle, on which the sea breaks in heavy weather—from this pinnacle, two rocks with 4 and $5\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms water over them, lie respectively N.N.E., distant nearly one cable, and W. by S., a quarter of a mile distant; these rocks with surrounding shoal ground of less than 20 fathoms, comprised within a diameter of about $5\frac{1}{2}$ cables, form the Main Ledge.

South Shoal, with $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms the least water, is situated S. by W. $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles from Virgin Rocks Main Ledge), and occupies a space 6 cables long in a N.E. and S.W. direction, with a breadth of $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables, the depths being under 20 fathoms. This shoal is reported by the fishermen to break heavier and to be more dangerous than the main ledge.

Main Ledge and South Shoal are the only dangers in ordinary weather, but several other spots on these shoals are reported to break in heavy gales—the foul ground, combined with the tidal stream, causing a confused sea even in strong breezes.

Position of shoal spot (3 fathoms) on main ledge, lat. $46^{\circ} 26' 57''$ N., long. $50^{\circ} 47' 40''$ W., depending upon Chain Rock Battery, St. John's, being in $52^{\circ} 40' 47''$ W.

EASTERN ROCKS.—The least water found on these shoals was 9 fathoms (Nine-Fathom Bank), near the centre of a group of shoal patches extending about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles in a N.N.E. and S.S.W. direction, with a breadth of 2 miles, having depths on them of from 12 to 25 fathoms.

Position of Nine-Fathom Bank, lat. $46^{\circ} 26' 45''$ N., long. $50^{\circ} 28' 6''$ W.

NOTE.—Eastern Rocks are the easternmost shoals known to the fishermen—those with 13 fathoms or less over them, are reported to break in heavy weather; with a strong breeze there is a confused sea in the locality.

In the immediate neighbourhood of Virgin and Eastern Rocks, the tidal stream attains a velocity of three-quarters of a knot an hour, but a few miles from them it is scarcely perceptible—during the period of the examination, a slight southerly set was experienced.

JESSE RYDER ROCK.—The position of this reported danger (lat. $46^{\circ} 29'$ N., long. $49^{\circ} 41'$ W.) was carefully examined throughout one day, but no indication of it was found either by variation in the soundings, or change in quality of bottom. The depths in the locality were found to be from 35 to 37 fathoms, over sand and shells.

BERTEL BANK.—The position assigned to this bank (lat. $44^{\circ} 43'$ N., long. $49^{\circ} 52'$ W.), was also carefully examined, but no sign of it was found. The depths near the position were found to be from 27 to 29 fathoms, over sand and shells.

NOTE.—The masters of various fishing vessels who have had many years experience on the Great Bank of Newfoundland, stated that to their knowledge no trace of shoal ground exists near the reported positions of Jesse Ryder Rock and Bertel Bank.

CAPE TESTA. NORTH TESTA ROCK.—This shoal, 22 yards in diameter, with a least depth of 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet on it, lies N. 82° W. from Cape Testa Lighthouse distant $1\frac{1}{10}$ miles nearly.

SOUTH TESTA ROCK.—This shoal, 33 yards in diameter, with a least depth of 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet, lies S. 58° W. from Cape Testa Lighthouse distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

A rock, 16 yards in diameter, with a least depth of 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet, lies S. 58° W. from Sta. Reparata Tower distant half a mile. Two shoals of small extent, with the least depths of 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet, lie respectively S. 53° W. three-quarters of a mile, and S. 46° W. 9 cables from Sta. Reparata Tower.

LONGO SARDO SHOAL.—This shoal, 16 yards in diameter, with a least depth of 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet, lies near the entrance to Port Longo, and bears N. 53° E. from Longo Sardo Tower distant $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables.

COLOMBO SHOAL.—This shoal, with a least depth of 23 feet and of small extent, lies off Point Rosso, and bears S. 32° E. from Paganito Rock distant $4\frac{1}{2}$ cables nearly.

PORT LISCIA.—A mud bank, with a least depth of 29 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet, lies at the entrance to Port Liscia, and bears S. 32° E. from East Point of Vacche Peninsula distant 3 cables nearly. A bank, about 100 yards in extent, with a least depth of 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet, lies within Port Liscia, and bears S. 41° W. from the East Point of Vacche Peninsula distant $4\frac{1}{2}$ cables.

PERDUTO ISLET.—Three shoals of small extent lie with the following bearings and distances from Perduto Islet:—

1. N. 9° W., distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables nearly.
2. N. 32° W., distant 2 cables nearly.
3. S. 58° W., distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables nearly.

CAVALLO SHOAL.—This rock, 30 feet in diameter, with a least depth of 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet, lies N. 58° E. from the north-east extreme of Lavezzi Island distant $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables nearly.

LAVEZZI SHOAL.—This bank, with a least depth of 33 feet and of small extent, lies S. 9° E. from Lavezzi Rock distant $4\frac{1}{2}$ cables nearly.

RAZZOLI SHOAL.—This cluster of rocks, with a least depth of 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet, lies in a north-westerly direction from the north-west coast of Razzoli Island distant about $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables.
