

the said new parish of Saint Mary Sheffield and of the said new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall which are described in the schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Matthias Sheffield.'

And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district and so soon as the same district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of such new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry Wilson his heirs and assigns for ever.

And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Matthias Sheffield being:—

"All that portion of the new parish of Saint Mary Sheffield and also all that contiguous portion of the new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall both within the original limits of the parish of Sheffield in the county of York and in the diocese of York which said portions of such new parishes are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point over the stream called or known as Porter Brook where the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall of the said new parish of Saint Mary Sheffield of the consolidated chapelry of Saint Simon Sheffield within the original limits of the said parish of Sheffield and of the new parish of Gillicar also within the original limits of the parish of Sheffield aforesaid all meet at which point the streets or roads called or known respectively as South-street Moor London-road Cemetery-road and Ecclesall New-road all join and extending thence that is from the said point of junction first westward and then north-westward along the boundary which divides the said new parish of Gillicar from the new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall aforesaid for a distance of thirty-one chains or thereabouts thereby following the course of Ecclesall New-road aforesaid and of William-street to the junction of the last-named street with Broomhall-street and with Broomhall-road and extending thence that is from the last-mentioned boundary south-westward along the middle of the said Broomhall-road for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Victoria-road and extending thence first southward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Collegiate-crescent-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of five and a-half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ecclesall New-road

and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Broomgrove-road and with the road called or known as Cemetery-avenue and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to a point at the stream called or known as Porter Brook aforesaid at the north-western corner of the Sheffield General Cemetery upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Andrew Sharrow within the original limits of the parish of Sheffield aforesaid and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of eighteen chains and a-half or thereabouts (thereby following the course of the said Porter Brook along the north-western side of the said cemetery) to the point in the middle of Montague-street where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Andrew Sharrow from the new parish of Saint Mary Sheffield aforesaid and extending thence first south-eastward then north-eastward and then southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of eighteen chains and a-half or thereabouts (thereby following the course of the streets or roads called or known respectively as Montague-street aforesaid Cemetery-road aforesaid and Washington-road) to the point where the said Washington-road is joined by Lansdowne-road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of thirteen chains and a-half or thereabouts to its junction with Cliffe-street and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of four and a-half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cemetery-road aforesaid and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to the first-described point over Porter Brook aforesaid where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the two new parishes out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.
