Fromps of Horse, and a confiderable Body of Poor state whose approach our Men retired about two miles, filling frill at the Enemy in the Rear, and then halted: The Irish came furiously on, and our Men received them with their small shor, and kill'd about 20 of them; upon this the high retired, and our Men advanced, and pur them inmediately to the rout, and had the chale of them through the Town of Lisnaskea, and all the way to Donagh, and then stopp'd, being come within view of the Enemies main Body, who were from ly worked between Dongh and New-Town-Burler; Our Men then refired to the place where this Skinnish began, expecting the rest of our Troops; and all this time we lost not one Man, and had only about half a dozen wounded, but kill d of the Enemy above 150, and took 34 Priloners: About to of the Clock, the rest of our Troops came up and joyned us, and then we were 1200 Horie and 1500 Foot, and fo we marched figuit forward towards New-Town-Butler, where at the steep Hill on this file the Town, the Enemy had potted theinfelves very advantageously, and kept the place about half an hour, firing most desperately at our Men, but they are the world Markimen in the World, for not one of ours was touch'd, but of their Men we kill'd about half a foore, and then they retued through New-Town-Bueler, having let the Tower, and all the Houses, on fire; and our Men pursued them to another steep Hill beyond New-Town-Butier, where they had placed their Cannon, and then they all taced about upon our Men, having 7 Cannon planted upon the Hill above the Road, and a great Bog on each fide, that the Horfe could not pais; but Colonel Wase ey, (who commanded our Forces,) sent a detached Party of Eoot through the Bogs on each fide the Read, upon whom the Enemy play with their Cannon and small-shot, but with the same Succels they had before, for not one of our Men were touch'd with the Cannon, and but 6 kill'd with the famili that; whereas weakill'd about 100 of the Enemy on the spot, where their Cannon was placed, with their Guiners, and took their Cannon, and then their whole Budy took the Chase, and ours after them, the Hosfe keeping the Road, and all their Foot betaking them to the Bogs that lay next Lough-Barne, and being all Strangers in, the Country, our Foot followed them till the Lough (topp'd them, killing them all the way; about 500 took the Lough, and were all drown'd, except one Man who fwum through. In short, of above 3 Regiments of Foot, not 20 elcaped, being either kill'd, taken, or drown'd: Our Horse pursued theirs all the way near to Cavan; we found about 2000 kill'd, besides what were drown'd, tand took above 300 Priloners, whereof above 50 were Commission Officers, and Lieurgnant-General Macarix one of them, who was brought hither dangeroully wounded.
