## Piesentations.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented to The Qucen, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the iame of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should aecompany this presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's comfand that nó presentation shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinculy voritlen upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.
