AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented to The Queen, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee; a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentation shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

ADDRESSES.

Notice is hereby given, that all persons having Petitions or Addresses to present to The Queen

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who

is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of your Majesty chapter fifty and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Kirby Moorside in the county and diocese of York for the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Holtby in the North Riding of the county of York and in the diocese of York and the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Full Sutton in the East Riding of the county of York and in the diocese of York.

“Whereas under or by virtue of a certain indenture of settlement dated the seventh day of August one thousand eight hundred and fifty and made between the Right Honourable William Lord Feversham Baron Feversham of the first part, William Ernest Earl of Feversham (then the Honourable William Ernest Duncombe) of the second part, the Honourable Lawrence Parsons of Lowndes-square in the county of Middlesex, and Sir Charles Slingsby of Scriven in the county of York Baronet of the third part and the Right Honourable William Walter Earl of Dartmouth (then the Right Honourable William Walter Leggo commonly called Viscount Lewisham) and Sir Charles William Strickland (then Charles William Strickland of Lincoln's-inn Esquire) of the fourth part, and a certain other indenture dated the sixth day of August one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one and made between the said William

Lord Feversham Baron Feversham and the said William Ernest Earl of Feversham (then the Honourable William Ernest Duncombe) of the first part the Right Honourable Sir James Robert George Graham of Netherby in the county of Cumberland Baronet and Mabel Violet Graham, second daughter of the said Sir James Robert George Graham of the second part, the Honourable John Winston Spencer Churchill commonly called the Marquis of Blandford and the Right Honourable Edward Adolphus Seymour commonly called Lord Seymour of the third part the said William Walter Earl of Dartmouth (then the Honourable William Walter Leggo) and Sir Charles William Strickland of the fourth part and the said Lawrence Parsons and Frederick Ulric Graham of Netherby aforesaid Esquire of the fifth part and a certain other indenture dated the third day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four and made between the said William Ernest Earl of Feversham of the first part the Right Honourable William Reginald Duncombe commonly called Viscount Helmsley of the second part and the said William Walter Earl of Dartmouth and William Beckett Denison and Charles Wilmer Duncombe of the third part and a certain other indenture dated the fourth day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four and made between the same parties as the last-heretofore recited indenture and an indenture dated the twenty-second day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six and made between the said William Ernest Earl of Feversham of the first part the said Viscount Helmsley of the second part the Right Honourable Charles John Chetwynd Earl of Shrewsbury of the third part the Right Honourable Lady Muriel Frances Louisa Talbot of the fourth part Charles Tyringham Praed and Edward Chaplin of the fifth part and the Right Honourable Charles Steward Vane Tempest commonly called Viscount Castlereagh and the Right Honourable Henry Arthur George Somerset commonly called Lord Arthur Somerset of the sixth part the perpetual advowsons, rights of patronage and presentation of in and to the said rectories of Holtby and Full Sutton now stand limited (with other hereditaments) subject to certain charges terms of years and powers of appointment made or created by or under the before-mentioned indentures or some of them to the use of the said William Ernest Earl of Feversham for life with divers remainders over and subject to a power of sale and exchange contained in the said indenture of the seventh day of August one thousand eight hundred and fifty and still in force being a power for the said William Walter Earl of Dartmouth and Charles William Strickland and the survivor of them and the executors or administrators of such survivor with the consent in writing of the person for the time being entitled to the possession or receipt of the rents and profits of the said hereditaments and premises thereby limited in strict settlement if of full age to sell or exchange for other manors lands or hereditaments in England all or any of the said hereditaments and premises (except as therein mentioned such exception not relating to the said advowsons).

“And whereas the perpetual advowson and right of patronage and presentation of in and to the vicarage of Kirby Moorside aforesaid is vested in your Majesty your heirs and successors in right of the Crown and the said right of patronage and presentation is exercised by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being acting on behalf of the Crown.

“And whereas it has been proposed to us that

the patronage of the rectories of Holtby and Full Sutton aforesaid and the patronage of the vicarage of Kirby Moorside aforesaid shall be exchanged in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said vicarage of Kirby Moorside and the said rectories of Holtby and Full Sutton and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to your Majesty that such circumstances and values respectively are as set forth in the schedule hereto annexed.

“And whereas by an indenture already prepared and intended to be executed immediately after the publication in the London Gazette of this scheme and any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and to bear date the day of the date of such publication as aforesaid and made between the said William Walter Earl of Dartmouth and Sir Charles William Strickland of the first part the said William Ernest Earl of Feversham of the second part the Right Honourable Hugh McCalmont Earl Cairns of the third part and your Majesty of the fourth part the perpetual advowsons rights of patronage and presentation of in and to the said rectories of Holtby and Full Sutton in the county and diocese of York are intended and expressed to be appointed to the use of your Majesty your heirs and successors in right of the Crown to the intent that the said rights of patronage and presentation may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Hugh McCalmont Earl Cairns as such Lord High Chancellor as aforesaid and by his successors Lords High Chancellors of Great Britain for the time being acting on behalf of your Majesty your heirs and successors in right of the Crown in exchange for the perpetual advowson right of patronage and presentation of in and to the said vicarage of Kirby Moorside in the county and diocese of York which last-named perpetual advowson right of patronage and presentation would by such Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid be as

from the day aforesaid transferred as contemplated by the present scheme.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said Hugh McCalmont Earl Cairns (testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than the said duly gazetted Order the whole perpetual advowson right of patronage and presentation of in and to the said vicarage of Kirby Moorside in the county and diocese of York and the church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from your Majesty your heirs and successors to and shall become and thenceforth be absolutely vested in the said William Walter Earl of Dartmouth and Sir Charles William Strickland and their heirs nevertheless to the uses upon the trusts and subject to the powers provisions agreements and declarations by and in the said settlement of the seventh day of August one thousand eight hundred and fifty and the other indentures hereinbefore recited limited or contained of or concerning (among other hereditaments) the said perpetual advowsons rights of patronage and presentation of in and to the rectories of Holtby and Full Sutton aforesaid by such indentures of settlement settled or to upon and subject to such of the same uses trusts powers provisions agreements and declarations as are still subsisting undetermined and capable of taking effect in exchange for the perpetual advowsons right of patronage and presentation of in and to the said rectories of Holtby and Full Sutton as from the same day to be conveyed to the use of your Majesty your heirs and successors for ever as aforesaid to the end and intent that the said last-mentioned rights of patronage and presentation may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Hugh McCalmont Earl Cairns and his successors as such Lords High Chancellors of Great Britain as aforesaid.

Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time, to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas Orders in Council have been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyards hereinafter mentioned from the time specified in such Orders; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyards be postponed:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards be postponed as follows; viz. :—

In the churchyard of All Saints, Hindley, Wigan, to the thirty-first of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

In the churchyard of Kirkley, in the county of Suffolk, to the first of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

The first 5 subjects are Obligatory.

* Candidates will be required to convert geocentric longitude and latitude into right ascension and declination, to find by the tables the hourly right ascension and declination of the Moon from her right ascension and declination at noon and midnight, and to compute, according to the method in the Appendix to the Nautical Almanac for 1836, the circumstances of an occultation of a star by the Moon.

II. A fee of £1 will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.

III. No Candidate will be eligible whose age on the first day of the Examination is less than 18 or more than 25.

WHEREAS the population of the said parish of Gwennap, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held at the Vestry Room, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Monday, the 25th day of March, 1878, it was resolved,—

“That the Churchwardens and Overseers be and are hereby directed to apply to the Local Government Board to issue an Order putting in force in this parish so much of the Vestry Act, 13 and 14 Vict., cap. 57, as applies to Vestry Rooms.”

And whereas the Churchwardens and Overseers of the said parish have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above resolution :

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows :

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other Meetings, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Gwennap.

ARTICLE II.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish.
