

the patronage of the rectories of Holtby and Full Sutton aforesaid and the patronage of the vicarage of Kirby Moorside aforesaid shall be exchanged in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said vicarage of Kirby Moorside and the said rectories of Holtby and Full Sutton and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to your Majesty that such circumstances and values respectively are as set forth in the schedule hereto annexed.

“And whereas by an indenture already prepared and intended to be executed immediately after the publication in the London Gazette of this scheme and any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and to bear date the day of the date of such publication as aforesaid and made between the said William Walter Earl of Dartmouth and Sir Charles William Strickland of the first part the said William Ernest Earl of Feversham of the second part the Right Honourable Hugh McCalmont Earl Cairns of the third part and your Majesty of the fourth part the perpetual advowsons rights of patronage and presentation of in and to the said rectories of Holtby and Full Sutton in the county and diocese of York are intended and expressed to be appointed to the use of your Majesty your heirs and successors in right of the Crown to the intent that the said rights of patronage and presentation may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Hugh McCalmont Earl Cairns as such Lord High Chancellor as aforesaid and by his successors Lords High Chancellors of Great Britain for the time being acting on behalf of your Majesty your heirs and successors in right of the Crown in exchange for the perpetual advowson right of patronage and presentation of in and to the said vicarage of Kirby Moorside in the county and diocese of York which last-named perpetual advowson right of patronage and presentation would by such Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid be as

from the day aforesaid transferred as contemplated by the present scheme.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said Hugh McCalmont Earl Cairns (testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than the said duly gazetted Order the whole perpetual advowson right of patronage and presentation of in and to the said vicarage of Kirby Moorside in the county and diocese of York and the church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from your Majesty your heirs and successors to and shall become and thenceforth be absolutely vested in the said William Walter Earl of Dartmouth and Sir Charles William Strickland and their heirs nevertheless to the uses upon the trusts and subject to the powers provisions agreements and declarations by and in the said settlement of the seventh day of August one thousand eight hundred and fifty and the other indentures hereinbefore recited limited or contained of or concerning (among other hereditaments) the said perpetual advowsons rights of patronage and presentation of in and to the rectories of Holtby and Full Sutton aforesaid by such indentures of settlement settled or to upon and subject to such of the same uses trusts powers provisions agreements and declarations as are still subsisting undetermined and capable of taking effect in exchange for the perpetual advowsons right of patronage and presentation of in and to the said rectories of Holtby and Full Sutton as from the same day to be conveyed to the use of your Majesty your heirs and successors for ever as aforesaid to the end and intent that the said last-mentioned rights of patronage and presentation may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Hugh McCalmont Earl Cairns and his successors as such Lords High Chancellors of Great Britain as aforesaid.
