The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th of November, 1879, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas considerable changes have within the last few years been made in the establishment of the various Civil Departments of the Admiralty, and in the salaries of officers therein, for which the sanction of your Majesty in Council has not yet been obtained: We therefore humbly submit that your Majesty in Council may be now pleased to sanction these changes.

"And whereas it seems to us desirable, in the interest of your Majesty's Service, that your Majesty in Council should authorize us to make, in future, with the concurrence of your Majesty's Treasury, such changes in the Establishments of the said Civil Departments of the Admiralty, and in the salaries of the officers therein, and also to issue such instructions to the officers of the said departments, as we may from time to time deem necessary.

"We humbly submit that your Majesty in Council may be pleased to authorize us to act accordingly."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
