*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

**PRESENTATIONS.**

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary than an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The Noblemen and Gentleman who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon; one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

**PRESENTATIONS.**

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations

shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

WHEREAS by section 18 of "The Extradition Act, 1870," it is among other things enacted, that if by any Law made after the passing of the said Act by the Legislature of any British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession; Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any Foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, either—

Suspend the operation within any such British Possession of the said Act, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such Foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer;

Or direct that such Law or Ordinance or any part thereof shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act:

And whereas by an Ordinance enacted by the Legislature of Grenada, the short title of which is, "The Extradition Ordinance, Grenada, 1880," it is provided that "all powers vested in and acts authorized or required to be done by a Police Magistrate or any Justice of the Peace in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals in the United Kingdom under 'The Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873,' are thereby vested in and may in the Colony be exercised and done by any Police Magistrate in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals under the said Acts":

And whereas it is further provided by the said Ordinance that the said Ordinance shall not come into operation until Her Majesty shall, by Order in Council, direct that the said Ordinance shall have effect within the Colony as if it were part of "The Extradition Act, 1870," but that the said Ordinance shall thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council shall have been publicly made known in the Colony.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of "The Extradition Act, 1870," and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, direct that the said Ordinance shall have effect in the Colony of Grenada without modification or alteration, as if it were part of "The Extradition Act, 1870."

And the Right Honourable Sir Michael Edward Hicks-Beach, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly. *C. L. Peel.*

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapeltries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme, in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by another Act of Parliament passed in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of Ecclesiastical Districts to Churches or Chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne; and for other purposes," it is amongst other things, further enacted "That when, by any Order of Her Majesty in Council as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the consent, in writing, of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be thereby affected, become a

“perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, and his successors, shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent-charges, and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the district parish formed under the Church Building Acts, for the church of such perpetual curacy sole and exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in anywise be subject to the control or interference of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or they shall have consented to such Order as aforesaid.”

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Hereford hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

“We the Right Reverend James Lord Bishop of Hereford do hereby represent to your Grace as follows.

1. “That within our diocese of Hereford is the rectory and parish church of Little Hereford in the county of Hereford with the chapelry or perpetual curacy of Ashford Carbonell in the county of Salop.

“That the limits and boundaries of the chapelry or parish of Ashford Carbonell are well known and defined.

2. “That the said chapelry or parish of Ashford Carbonell contains a church long since erected the distance of which church from the said parish church of Little Hereford is three miles or thereabouts.

3. “That according to the census of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one the population of the said parish of Little Hereford exclusive of the said chapelry or parish of Ashford Carbonell is five hundred and nine and the population of the said chapelry or parish of Ashford Carbonell amounts according to the same census to three hundred and forty-one.

4. “That the said chapelry or parish of Ashford Carbonell appears to have been immemorially treated as a separate parish for all civil purposes and it also appears that baptisms churchings marriages and burials have heretofore been and are now performed in the said church of Ashford Carbonell for the inhabitants thereof.

5. “That the inhabitants of the said chapelry or parish of Ashford Carbonell have from time immemorial resorted to the church within the said chapelry or parish and have repaired the said church by separate rates levied on the said chapelry or parish of Ashford Carbonell for the separate and distinct repair thereof and in such chapelry or parish the inhabitants thereof have elected from among themselves churchwardens overseers and other parish officers for the same.

6. “That the said chapelry or parish of Ashford Carbonell is not in any way connected with the parish of Little Hereford in respect of rates of any kind nor are the inhabitants of the said chapelry or parish of Ashford Carbonell entitled to any accommodation in the said parish church of Little Hereford nor are the inhabitants of the said parish of Little Hereford entitled to accommodation in the said church of Ashford Carbonell.

7. “That the net annual value of the said rectory of Little Hereford including the said chapelry or perpetual curacy of Ashford Carbonell is three hundred and twenty pounds arising partly from rent-charges given in commutation of tithes and partly from glebe and partly from surplice fees and Easter offerings.

8. “That the patronage of the said rectory and parish church of Little Hereford with the said chapelry or perpetual curacy of Ashford Carbonell belongs to the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Worcester in right of his See and the Reverend Augustus William Gurney is the present incumbent thereof.

9. “That it appears to us that the said chapelry or parish of Ashford Carbonell may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty chapter one hundred and six and of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty chapter forty-nine be advantageously separated from the said rectory and parish church of Little Hereford and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a separate benefice and perpetual curacy which shall be endowed with a clear yearly income of two hundred pounds or thereabouts.

10. “That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Act of Parliament we have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the aforesaid patron and incumbent respectively of the said rectory of Little Hereford with Ashford Carbonell to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme certify the same to Her Majesty in Council.

“Given under our hand this seventeenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

And whereas the scheme and consents referred to in the representation are in the words and figures following:—

“The SCHEME above referred to.

“1. That the chapelry or parish of Ashford Carbonell shall be separated from the rectory and parish church of Little Hereford and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice by the name or style of ‘The Perpetual Curacy of Ashford Carbonell’ of which the church within the said parish shall be the parish church.

2. “That such perpetual curacy of Ashford Carbonell shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said rectory of Little Hereford and the incumbent of such perpetual curacy shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

3. “That there being attached or belonging to the church of the said chapelry or perpetual curacy of Ashford Carbonell a piece of meadow land containing eight acres one rood and eight perches situate in the parish of Coreley in the county of Salop and numbered 336 on the tithe apportionment map of the said parish of Coreley and that there also being also belonging to the said church of Ashford Carbonell three pieces or parcels of arable and meadow land containing

altogether by admeasurement ten acres and fifteen perches situate in the said parish of Little Hereford and numbered respectively 538, 539 and 541 on the tithe apportionment map for the said parish of Little Hereford the whole being of the annual value of thirty pounds having been purchased in the years one thousand seven hundred and sixty-five and one thousand eight hundred and seventeen by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne on the augmentation of the said church of Ashford Carbonell such lands shall belong to and form part of the endowments of the separate benefice and perpetual curacy of Ashford Carbonell so to be constituted in addition to a grant of one hundred and seventy pounds per annum which the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have agreed to grant to the same separated benefice so as to make up the annual income thereof to two hundred pounds.

4. "That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for churchings marriages, burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the said parish of the proposed separate benefice of Ashford Carbonell and all such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within the said proposed separate parish or benefice shall belong to the incumbent thereof.

5. That the right of patronage of or right of nomination to the proposed separate benefice so to be constituted shall be for ever vested in the Bishop of Worcester.

6. That the inhabitants of the said proposed separate parish of Ashford Carbonell shall be exonerated as heretofore from all liability to repair the parish church of Little Hereford or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected in such parish and shall not be entitled to accommodation in any other church than the church of Ashford Carbonell nor shall the parishioners of Little Hereford be entitled to any accommodation in the church of the said separate benefice.

#### " CONSENTS.

" We the Right Reverend Henry Lord Bishop of Worcester the patron or person entitled to present to the rectory of Little Hereford with Ashford Carbonell annexed in the counties of Hereford and Salop and diocese of Hereford in case the same were now vacant and I the Reverend Augustus William Gurney M.A. Rector of the said rectory do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed and to all matters and things therein mentioned.

" Dated this sixteenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

And whereas the said Lord Bishop of Hereford hath transmitted the said scheme to the said Lord Archbishop of Canterbury together with the said consents.

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council dated the 3rd day of February 1880 which report is in the words and figures following:—

" To the QUEEN's Most Excellent in Majesty in Council.

" We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council.

" That the Right Reverend James Lord Bishop

of Hereford has represented unto us (amongst other things):

" That within the diocese of Hereford is the rectory and parish church of Little Hereford in the county of Hereford with the chapelry or perpetual curacy of Ashford Carbonell in the county of Salop.

" That the limits and boundaries of the said chapelry are well known and defined.

" That the said chapelry contains a church the distance of which church from the parish church of Little Hereford is three miles or thereabouts.

" That the patronage of the said rectory and parish church of Little Hereford with the said chapelry or perpetual curacy of Ashford Carbonell belongs to the Lord Bishop of Worcester in right of his See and the Reverend Augustus William Gurney is the present Incumbent thereof.

" That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said chapelry or parish of Ashford Carbonell may be advantageously separated from the said rectory and parish church of Little Hereford and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice.

" That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patron and incumbent of the said benefice has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

" The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

" And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

" As witness our hand the third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered that the said scheme of the said Lord Bishop of Hereford be carried into effect.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the nineteenth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words following; that is to say:

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Peter, situate in the antient chapelry of North Newton, in the parish of North Petherton, in the county of Somerset, and in the diocese of Bath and Wells.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Peter, situate in the antient chapelry of North Newton aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of North Petherton which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Peter situate in the antient chapelry of North Newton as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, North Newton.'

"And with the like consent of the said Arthur Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Peter situate in the antient chapelry of North Newton as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Peter North Newton being:—

"All that part of the parish of North Petherton in the county of Somerset and in the diocese of Bath and Wells, which comprises amongst other territory the antient chapelry of North Newton, and which said part is bounded on the north-east by the new parish of North Moor Green on the east partly by the said new parish partly by the particular district or new parish of Burrowbridge and partly by a certain portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Stoke Saint Gregory, on the south partly by the parish of Lyng and partly by the ecclesiastical parish of Thurloxton-with-Durston all in the county and diocese aforesaid on

part of the west by the last-named cure and upon all other sides that is to say on the remaining part of the west and on the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said ecclesiastical parish of Thurloxton-with-Durston from the parish of North Petherton aforesaid at a point in the middle of the turnpike-road leading from Taunton to North Petherton and Bridgwater a little to the north of the western end of Higher Moon-lane and extending thence northward along the middle of the said turnpike-road for a distance of about one mile to the centre of Buncombe's Brook Bridge which carries the same turnpike-road over the stream called or known as Buncombe's Brook and extending thence first eastward and then southward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to its junction with the stream called or known as Spring Brook and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-named stream for a distance of about half a mile to the point where the same stream strikes the northern side of the Taunton and Bridgwater Canal and continuing thence south-eastward and in a direct line to a point in the middle of the said canal and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of the same canal for a distance of about one mile and twenty-five chains to the boundary which divides the said parish of North Petherton from the new parish of North Moor Green aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Bath and Wells. *C.
