

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Yorkshire, holden at Sheffield. In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against John Thompson, of Victoria Works, Allen-street, in the parish of Sheffield, in the county of York, Steel and File Manufacturer, carrying on business under the style of firm of John Thompson and Son.

UPON the hearing of this Petition this day, and upon proof satisfactory to the Court of the debt of the Petitioner, and of the trading, and of the act of Bankruptcy alleged to have been committed by the said John Thompson having been given, it is ordered that the said John Thompson be, and he is hereby, adjudged bankrupt.—Given under the Seal of the Court this 1st day of April, 1880.
