

**NOTICE OF INTENDED DISTRIBUTION OF NAVAL PRIZE-MONEY.**

*Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy and Comptroller of Navy Pay, Admiralty, April 5, 1880.*

NOTICE is hereby given to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines, and to all persons interested therein, that the distribution of the slave and tonnage bounty awarded for two slaves and the slave dhow "Fathelkheir," captured on the 9th and 18th January, 1879, respectively, by Her Majesty's ship "London," will commence on Friday, the 16th instant, in the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant-General of the Navy and Comptroller of Navy Pay, Admiralty, New-street, Spring-gardens, S.W."

Agents and other persons holding powers of attorney, prize orders, assignments, or other instruments, by virtue of which they may be legally entitled to claim the share of any captor serving in the above-named ship, are requested to present the same at this office.

Any Officer, Seaman, Marine, or other person who may desire to receive his share from the Collector of Customs or of Inland Revenue within the United Kingdom, is required to intimate the same by letter to be addressed "On Prize Business, to the Accountant-General of the Navy and Comptroller of Navy Pay, Admiralty, London, S.W." (enclosing his certificate of service or an attested copy thereof, excepting in the case of Commissioned Officers),—in which letter his own place of residence is to be precisely stated, as well as the place of the nearest Collector of Customs, or of Inland Revenue, from whom it would be convenient to receive such share of prize money.

**INCOME TAX.**

WHEREAS the Acts of Parliament relating to the Income Tax provide that all persons entrusted with the payment of

Annuities, or any dividends or shares of annuities payable out of the revenue of any colony or settlement belonging to the Crown of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or out of the revenue of any foreign State;

Annuities, pensions, or other annual sums payable out of the funds of any institution in India; or

Any interest, dividends, or other annual payment, payable out of or in respect of the stocks, funds, or shares of any foreign or colonial company, society, adventure, or concern

to any persons, corporations, companies, or societies in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or acting therein as agents, or in any other character, shall, without further notice or demand thereof, deliver or cause to be delivered into the Head Office for Inland Revenue, an

account, in writing, containing their names and residences, and a description of the annuities, pensions, or other annual sums, dividends, shares, or interest entrusted to them for payment, within one calendar month after the same shall have been required by public notice in the London Gazette, in order that an assessment may be made thereon, at the rate of duty prescribed by the Act of the late session of Parliament, 43 Victoria, chap. 14: Her Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue do hereby give notice to all persons entrusted with the payment of any such annuities, pensions, or other annual sums, dividends, shares of annuities, or interest as aforesaid, that the accounts of the said annuities, &c., required by the said Acts, are to be delivered, in writing, into the Head Office for Inland Revenue, at Somerset House, in the county of Middlesex, addressed to the Secretary of the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, within the space of one calendar month from the date hereof; and that any person who shall neglect or refuse to deliver such account, is, by the said Acts, made subject to the forfeiture of one hundred pounds, over and above the duty chargeable on such annuities, shares, dividends, or interest.

**Chapel-en-le-Frith Union.**

Parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith, in the county of Derby;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said Parish, held, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the twentieth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, it was resolved,—

"That by virtue of an Act of Parliament made and passed in the 13th and 14th Victoria, cap. 57, intituled, 'An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks,' the Churchwardens of the Parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith, in the County of Derby, do make an application to the Local Government Board to make an Order under their Seal of Office that the above-mentioned Act shall be applied to and put in force within such Parish."

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said Parish have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above Resolution;

And whereas so much of the said Act as relates to the providing of a room for the purpose of holding Vestry Meetings was applied to and put in force within the said Parish by an Order of the Poor Law Board dated the twenty-second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the above-mentioned Act as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said Parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith.

ARTICLE II.—The duties of the Vestry Clerk for the time being appointed under the authority
