The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the nineteenth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and twenty-four sections three five and seven have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty the following scheme relating to the endowment of the See of Durham.

"Whereas by the said Act it is enacted that on the avoidance from time to time of any See after the assignment of an endowment for the same our Estates Committee may if they shall think fit revise the arrangement in force in relation to such endowment and for that purpose enquire into the state and productiveness of such endowment and if such endowment in the judgment of the Committee will secure a net annual income exceeding that named for the archbishop or bishop as aforesaid, or will not secure the full amount of such annual income such Committee may report thereon to us, and that we shall if we think fit, make an arrangement by vesting part of the lands and hereditaments constituting such endowment in us, or by assigning lands and hereditaments by way of addition to such endowment, or by means of annual or other payments to or by us as the case may require which may secure in the judgment of the said Committee to the archbishop or bishop who may succeed upon that avoidance, the net annual income named for the archbishop or bishop of such See by any Act of Parliament or Order in Council then in force, or as near thereto as circumstances will allow Provided always that if a difference of opinion as to the value or sufficiency of the estates which such Committee may propose to leave or to assign to any See shall arise between the archbishop or bishop thereof and the said Committee such difference shall be settled by arbitration before such arrangement as is last-mentioned shall be made.

"And whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, made under the provisions of the said Act bearing date the twenty-fifth day of July one

thousand eight hundred and sixty-one and duly published in the London Gazette on the twenty-sixth day of the same month certain lands and hereditaments were assigned as the endowment of the See of Durham, and by another Order of your Majesty in Council, made under the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven and bearing date the twenty-sixth day of February one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven which last-mentioned Order was duly published in the London Gazette on the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, certain of the lands and hereditaments which had been so assigned as aforesaid as the endowment of the said See were exchanged for other lands and hereditaments belonging to us.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Joseph Barber the present Bishop of Durham succeeded to the said See on an avoidance thereof which occurred on or about the fifth day of February now last past.

"And whereas at the date of such avoidance the endowment of the said See consisted of the lands stock and hereditaments set forth in the schedules marked A and B annexed to this scheme, saving always to us and our successors in manner set forth in the two hereinbefore mentioned Orders of your Majesty in Council, the minerals under the said lands and hereditaments and the right to work the same or other minerals.

"And whereas our Estates Committee have upon such avoidance revised the arrangement in force in relation to the endowment of the said See and for that purpose have enquired into the state and productiveness of such endowment and have reported to us that such endowment will in their judgment secure a net annual income exceeding that named for the Bishop of the said See by the hereinbefore first-recited Order of your Majesty in Council, videlicet, eight thousand pounds per annum and that the arrangement embodied in the recommendations hereinafter contained will secure in their judgment, to the said Bishop a net annual income of eight thousand pounds, or as near thereto as circumstances will allow.

"And whereas the lands and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule marked C annexed to this scheme are vested in us for an estate of fee simple in possession.

"And whereas no difference of opinion has arisen between the said Bishop and the said Committee as to the fact that the estates which the said Committee propose should be left and assigned respectively to the said See are sufficient to produce the net average annual income of eight thousand pounds and no more.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Joseph Barber Bishop of Durham (testified by his having signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we humbly recommend and propose with a view to securing to the said Bishop the said net annual income of eight thousand pounds, that upon the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly published Order, the lands stock and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule marked A annexed to this scheme, including all rent-charges in lieu of tithes arising out of or charged on the said lands and now vested in the said Bishop which lands stock and hereditaments are estimated to produce the net average annual income of two thousand four hundred and twenty-four pounds or thereabouts, shall with their appurtenances and all the right title estate

and interest therein of the said Bishop of Durham and his successors together with the benefit of the perpetual land-tax (if any) charged upon the same premises which has been redeemed, be and become transferred to and vested in us and our successors and that we shall be entitled to the rents profits and proceeds of the same as from the hereinbefore mentioned date of avoidance of the said See.

“And we also recommend and propose with a view to the securing of such net annual income as aforesaid that upon such publication as aforesaid of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any further conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly published Order all the lands tithes and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule marked C annexed to this scheme including all rent-charges in lieu of tithes arising out of or charged on the said lands and now vested in us which lands tithes and hereditaments are estimated to produce the net average annual income of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three pounds with their appurtenances and all our right title and interest therein (save and except and always reserved unto us and our successors and our and their lessees tenants and assigns) all and singular the mines quarries and beds of coal stone and clay sand minerals and metalliferous substances of all descriptions therein or thereunder with full and exclusive authority to sink win work get up and carry away the same in under out of and from the said lands and hereditaments or any other lands and

hereditaments according to the course and practice at present or hereafter to be used or adopted in the county of Durham or according to the most approved mode which may from time to time be used or invented and to enter upon take use and occupy from time to time and for such time and in such manner as we our successors lessees tenants and assigns shall think fit so much of the said lands and hereditaments as we shall deem necessary proper or convenient for all or any of the aforesaid purposes making full compensation for any injury thereby occasioned and save and except and always reserved full and exclusive authority for us our successors lessees tenants and assigns or persons acting under our authority and whether in reference or respect to lands held by or under us or any other property to make grant and use any way or ways upon across under or through the said lands and hereditaments for the purposes aforesaid shall together with the benefit of the perpetual land tax (if any) charged upon the same premises, be and become vested in the said Bishop of Durham and his successors and that the said Bishop shall be entitled to the rents profits and proceeds thereof as from the hereinbefore mentioned date of avoidance of the said See.

And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

“And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said exchange would be in conformity with the intention of and expedient for the objects contemplated by the said recited Acts.

“And whereas by an indenture already prepared and intended to be executed immediately after the publication in the London Gazette of this scheme and any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and which said indenture is intended to bear date the day of the date of such publication as aforesaid and expressed to be made between the said Richard Baker Wingfield Baker of the first part the said George Digby Wingfield Digby of the second part the said Benjamin Earl of Beaconsfield as the First Commissioner for the time being of your Majesty's Treasury of the third part and your Majesty of the fourth part the advowson donation and perpetual right of patronage nomination and presentation of and to the rectory of Mappowder in the county of Dorset and diocese of Salisbury is intended and expressed to be conveyed to the use of your Majesty and your heirs and successors for ever in right of the Crown to the intent that the said right of patronage nomination and presentation may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Benjamin Earl of Beaconsfield or other the First Commissioner of your Majesty's Treasury for the

time being acting for and on behalf of your Majesty and your heirs and successors in right of the Crown in exchange for the advowson of Sherborne aforesaid which said last-named advowson will by such Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid be as from the day aforesaid transferred as contemplated by the present scheme.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said Benjamin Earl of Beaconsfield as such First Commissioner of your Majesty’s Treasury as aforesaid (testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and the said duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage nomination and presentation of and to the said vicarage of Sherborne in the county of Dorset and diocese of Salisbury and the church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from your Majesty and your heirs and successors to and shall become and thenceforth be absolutely vested in the said Richard Baker Wingfield Baker and his heirs

nevertheless to the uses upon the trusts and to and for the ends intents and purposes and with under and subject to the powers provisoes and declarations by and in the said indenture of the twenty-third day of December one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two by reference to the said recited will of the said Earl Digby and the said first codicil thereto limited declared and contained concerning (amongst other hereditaments) the said advowson donation and perpetual right of patronage of and to the rectory of Mappowder aforesaid or to upon and for such of the same uses trusts ends intents purposes powers provisoes and declarations as are now subsisting and capable of taking effect in exchange for the perpetual advowson donation and right of patronage nomination and presentation of and to the said rectory of Mappowder as from the same day to be conveyed to the use of your Majesty and your heirs and successors for ever as aforesaid to the end and intent that the said last-mentioned right of patronage nomination and presentation may from time to time and and at all times be exercised by the said Benjamin Earl of Beaconsfield or other the First Commissioner of your Majesty’s Treasury for the time being for and on behalf of your Majesty and your heirs and successors as aforesaid.”

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 19th of *March*, 1880, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas your Majesty was graciously pleased by your Order in Council of the 22nd *February*, 1870, Sec. II. Par. 6, to make the following provision as regards officers of your Majesty's Navy accepting the Regulations then established, viz. :—

‘Captains retired from that rank to be entitled to rise by seniority to the rank of Retired Rear-Admiral if before retirement they had served the time to qualify them for promotion.’

“thus restricting the award of Retired Flag Rank to officers qualified for their Active Flag, and whereas under your Majesty's subsequent Order in Council of the 5th *August*, 1875, all Captains retired from that rank have become entitled to one step in rank, by seniority, irrespective of service, the distinction between officers qualified and not qualified for promotion being thereby abolished; We would humbly represent to your Majesty that we consider the distinction reasonable, and we are of opinion that it is

expedient to grant to Captains qualified for promotion a concession proportionate to that conferred by your Majesty's Order in Council of 5th *August* 1875 on unqualified officers.

“We would therefore humbly submit that your Majesty will be pleased to sanction the following provisions, viz. :—

“1. Captains who have been or may be retired from that rank (unless retired on account of non-service) to be allowed to rise to the rank of Vice-Admiral on the Retired List if before retirement they had or shall have served the time necessary to qualify a Captain for promotion to the rank of Rear-Admiral on the Active List.

“2. Such advancement to be conferred according to seniority, any officer hereby qualified for Vice-Admiral's rank, and who has been debarred from rising above the rank of Rear-Admiral by the restrictions of the Order in Council of the 22nd *February*, 1870, to date his promotion to Vice-Admiral from the day on which he would have been promoted had such restrictions not been in operation.

“3. Promotion not to confer claim to increase of Retired Pay.”

Her Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
