PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary than an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. WHEREAS by "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878," it is (among other things) provided that the Board of Trade shall from time to time cause such new denominations of Standards, being either equivalent to or multiples or aliquot parts of the imperial weights and measures ascertained by the said Act, as appear to them to be required in addition to those mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act, to be made and duly verified, and that those new denominations of Standards, when approved by Her Majesty in Council, shall be Board of Trade Standards in like manner as if they were mentioned in the said Schedule :

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Board of Trade that a new denomination of Standard measure of Five-gallons being a multiple of the imperial measure of capacity of a gallon ascertained by the said Act, is required, and they have caused the same to be made and duly verified and deposited in their custody :

And whereas the Board of Trade have given to the said new Standard measure of capacity the denomination of "Five-gallon Measure :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve of the "Five-gallon Measure" as a new denomination of Standard, and doth direct that the same shall be a Board of Trade Standard in like manner as if it was mentioned in the second schedule to "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878."

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, is pleased to continue the powers of the University of Cambridge Commissioners until the 31st day of December, 1881.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy ; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven ; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five ; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two ; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eighteenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words and figures following ; that is to say :—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint George situate at Perry Hill in the district parish of Christ Church Forest Hill in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said district parish of Christ Church Forest Hill and of the parish of Lewisham in the county and diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such district parish and parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said district parish of Christ Church Forest Hill and of the said parish of Lewisham should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint George situate at Perry Hill as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester with the consent of the Right Honourable William Walter Earl of Dartmouth the patron of both of the vicarage of the said parish of Lewisham and also of the vicarage of the said district parish of Christ Church Forest Hill (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said district parish of Christ Church Forest Hill and of the said parish of Lewisham which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions

together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint George situate at Perry Hill aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint George Perry Hill.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint George Perry Hill being:—

"All that portion of the district parish of Christ Church Forest Hill in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Rochester wherein the present incumbent of such district parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the south by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels Bell Green, Lower Sydenham, on the east by the hereinafter described portion of the parish of Lewisham on the north by the new parish of Saint Saviour Brockley Hill all in the county and diocese aforesaid and on the remaining side that is to say, on the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Saviour Brockley Hill from the district parish of Christ Church Forest Hill aforesaid at the point where Stanstead-road is joined by Brockley-road and by Cranston-road and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nearly six chains to its present southern end where it is joined by the public footpath leading to Perry Vale and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of the said public footpath for a distance of twenty-nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wolstone-road and extending thence southwestward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roads called or known respectively as Perry Vale and as Perry Rise and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of seven and a half-chains or thereabouts to a point upon the boundary which divides the said district parish of Christ Church Forest Hill from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels Bell Green Lower Sydenham aforesaid opposite to a boundary-stone inscribed 'L. S. B. G. C. C. 1879 No. 2' and situate on the western side of the road called or known as Perry Rise as aforesaid.

"And also all that contiguous portion of the parish of Lewisham aforesaid wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the south by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels Bell Green Lower Sydenham aforesaid on the west partly by the hereinbefore described portion of the district parish of Christ Church Forest Hill and partly by the new parish of Saint Saviour Brockley Hill aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the north-west on the north-east, and on the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Saviour Brockley Hill from the parish of Lewisham aforesaid at the point at or near to the north-eastern end of the road called or known as Codrington-hill where the said road is joined by the footpath leading northwards to Brockley-lane and extending thence

that is from the last-mentioned boundary north-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned footpath for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its intersection by the public footpath leading from the Brockley Inn to Catford Bridge at or near to which point of intersection a boundary-stone inscribed 'P. H. St. G. C. C. 1880 No. 1' has been placed and extending thence generally south-eastward along the middle of the last-described public footpath for a distance of thirty-four and a half chains or thereabouts to the point near the bank of the Ravensbourne River where such footpath is joined by the footpath which leads from Ladywell along the said river bank at or near to which point a boundary-stone inscribed 'P. H. St. G. C. C. 1880 No. 2' has been placed and extending thence due eastward and in a direct line for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the line of the Mid-Kent Railway distant twenty chains or thereabouts to the north of the bridge over the same line of railway at Catford Bridge Station and extending thence southward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of one mile and nineteen chains or thereabouts (thereby passing through the said railway station) to the boundary which divides the said parish of Lewisham from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels Bell Green Lower Sydenham aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifteenth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty in the words following; that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Peter and Saint Paul situate at Upper Teddington in the parish of Teddington in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that

a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Peter and Saint Paul situate at Upper Teddington aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend John Bishop of the said diocese of London (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Teddington which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Peter and Saint Paul situate at Upper Teddington as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter and Saint Paul Upper Teddington.'

"And with the like consent of the said John Bishop of the said diocese of London (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages baptisms churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Peter and Saint Paul situate at Upper Teddington as aforesaid and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend Robert Digby Ram the present vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Teddington shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent all the fees which may be received in respect of the performance of the offices aforesaid at the said church of Saint Peter and Saint Paul shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Robert Digby Ram and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Peter and Saint Paul Upper Teddington being:—

"All that part of the parish of Teddington in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London which is bounded on the south and on the south-west by the district parish of Hampton Wick by the parish of Hampton and by the district chapelry of Saint James Hampton Hill all in the county and diocese aforesaid on the north-west by the parish of Hanworth in the said county and diocese on the north by the new parish of the Holy Trinity Twickenham in the same county and diocese and on the remaining side that is to say on the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Twickenham from the parish of Teddington aforesaid at a point in the middle of the Kingston Line of the London and South Western Railway a little to the west of Waldon Villa and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of one mile and twenty-two and a half chains or thereabouts (thereby passing through the Ted-

dington Railway Station) to the point where the same line of railway first crosses the boundary dividing the said parish of Teddington from the district parish of Hampton Wick aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyard be postponed as follows; viz.:—

In the churchyard of All Saints, Hindley, Wigan, to the thirtieth of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.
