In the County Court of Northumberland, holden at Newcastle.

In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against Margaret Maria Ord, of No. 12, Howard-street, North Shields, in the county of Northumberland, Wine and Spirit Merchant, and residing at Stanwise-street, Tynemouth, in the same county, trading as Ord and Company.
