The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifteenth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words and figures following, that is to say :-

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-nine have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme having reference to the parish of Malpas situate partly in the county of Chester and partly in the county of Flint and wholly in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas the said parish of Malpas is a parish in which both the profits and the spiritual charge are divided between two incumbents each having a mediety of the benefice, that is to say, of the benefice and rectory of Malpas.

"And whereas the Right Reverend William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester in pursuance of the Act firstly hereinbefore mentioned, has submitted to us a plan bearing date the twentysecond day of January in this present year one thousand eight hundred and eighty for consti-tuting the said two medieties (known respectively as the Upper Mediety and the Lower Mediety) of the said benefice of Malpas into separate benefices as from the next avoidance of the said Lower Mediety of the same benefice by the names in the said plan appearing and for making (certain other arrangements which are likely in the opinion of the said Bishop and in our opinion to promote the efficient discharge of pastoral duties in the said parish of Malpas that is to say within the same parish as it now is and also within two cures called respectively the Holy Trinity Bickerton and Saint Chad Malpas now otherwise known as and hereinafter called Saint Chad Tushingham which said cures were formed out of the same parish of Malpas.
