1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's

 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the
 Act 40 Vic., cap. 2, to the amount of £1,479,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000,
 £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 7th
 day of June, 1880, and will be payable at
 three or six months after date (at the option of
 the persons tendering), viz. :—on the 7th Septem-
 ber or 7th December next, respectively.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount
 per cent. which will be given for the amounts
 applied for; and the tenders of private individuals
 must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank
 of England.
