From the Camp before Menra, September 2. The 24th of the last month we continued to work on leveral Mines, in the last month we continued to work on leveral Mines, in order to blow up the Palifadoes planted on the top of the Glacis of the Counterfearp. The 25th the Imperialists threw a great many Bombes into the Counterfearp, and the night following forang a Mine at the left Angle of the Attack of the Covered Way, and made a lodgment there. The Prince Palatin of Weldentz was mortally wounded in the Trenches. The 25th we continued to fap the Glacis of

the Counterfearp, and fecured our two new Redoubles with Palifadoes. The 27th four Deferrers reported, that, our Bombes and Carcaffes had done great executions and that there were 1500 wounded in the Town. The great Battery of 36 Pieces of Cannon and 10 Mortars as the Saxon and Bivarian Attack was finished this day. The 28th at lax in the morning it began to play upon the Townand the Citadel, the Elector of Bavaria having ordered, that all the Muskeriers should first give 3 Volleys, and that at each Volley & Bombes should be shot into the Place, which was performed with the found of Trumpers, Kettledums, and lauthoys. At the same time the Imperialists and Lunenburgers made a great fire from their Batteries, as did like Hautboys. The Enemy answered with their Cannon and Hautboys from their Ramparts. The night following we continued our Works at both Attacks. The timperfailing as a valued with sapping above to paces on the right and left. And the Bayarians made a Line of Communication to their great Battery, and a new place of Arms. The 29th the Elector of Bavaria went to the Juke of Lorrain's Quarters, and viewed the Works on that fide. We discovered I we also the Enemies Mines; and our Batteries play divery finite with the Bastions of St. James, St. Martin, Alexander, and Bomface, as also the Curtains. The 30th one of our Bombes set fire to another pacel of Hand Granadoes, which the Enemy had brought together on the Counterscarp. The 31 a Deferter came out of the Town, and reported, that the Garison which at the beginning of the Siege conlisted of 8000, was now hardly 5000 righting Men; but that they had Ammunition enough. The Bevarians brought five Pieces of Cannon to bear upon the Counterfear. They have begun another Mine on the left hand, which we are countermining. Our Caimon have made great Breaches; so that we are now preparing for a Storm. We hear that the Duke of Duras intends to attempt the Relief Our Cainon have made great of the place; If he does, we do not doubt but to give him a good reception.

Francfort, September 4. The Duke of Duras, who was according to our last advice encamped at Lichtenau with 18000 Men, but many of them sick, makes Preparations for the relieving of Mentz, which by the Boats he is arming, he seems resolved to attempt by Water; and the Imperialists to hinder his design, are laying Chains cross the River not far from their Bridge of Boats, filling the Rhine with Flotes, & An Express come this day from the Camp before Mentz, says, that their Cannon had made such large breaches, that they could see into the Streets of the Town, and that we shall now quickly hear of their storming it. Duke Christian of Saxony, was killed last night in the Trenches. The Duke of Hanouer sends a Body of his Troops to just the Army before Mentz.
