THE following Address of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, having been transmitted by Francis Robert, Earl of Rosslyn, to the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been by him presented to the Queen, which Address Her Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously :—

May it please your Majesty,

WE, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland met in General Assembly, beg most respectfully to acknowledge Your Majesty's gracious letter, and the assurances therein contained of the interest Your Majesty is pleased to take in our Annual Meeting.

We desire to express the satisfaction we feel in Your Majesty's declaration of Your Majesty's approval of the wisdom and prudence which have characterised our proceedings in times past. And we earnestly pray that the same spirit may pervade this Assembly, and that all our deliberations may result in the fulfilment of Your Majesty's hope that, under the Divine blessing, the moral and religious improvement of Your Majesty's subjects in Scotland will be thereby promoted.

Having already experienced many proofs of the ability, courtesy, and dignity wherewith the Earl of Rosslyn discharges the duties of Your Majesty's Commissioner, we are much gratified that he has been again called to represent Your Majesty in this Assembly.

For Your Majesty's gift of two thousand pounds for the benefit of the Highlands and Islands of Scotland, which has proved the source of so much good to these districts for many years, we have once more to offer our grateful thanks.

That God may abundantly bless Your Majesty and all the members of the Royal Family is the fervent prayer of

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme, in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall on full

"consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect; and such Order being registered in the registry of the diocese, which the Registrar is hereby required to do, shall be forthwith binding on all persons whatsoever, including the Incumbent or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected thereby, if he or they shall have consented thereto in writing under his or their hands."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of York hath made a report in writing dated the 10th day of May, 1880 to Her Majesty in Council in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the undersigned William by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of York do certify to your Majesty in Council:

"That the Right Reverend William Lord Bishop of Chester has represented to us that it appears to him that the township of Davenport (more particularly described in the scheme hereunto annexed) now part of the parish of Astbury in the county of Chester and diocese of Chester may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Astbury and annexed to the parish of Swettenham in the said county and diocese to which it is contiguous for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a representation and scheme in writing and has transmitted the same to us for our consideration describing the mode in which it appears to him that the separation and annexation may be best effected with justice to all parties.

"That the patrons and incumbents of the parish church of Astbury aforesaid and the parish church of Swettenham aforesaid are consenting parties to the scheme hereunto annexed.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Chester together with the consents of the patrons and incumbents are hereunto annexed.

"That the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme doth hereby certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case Her Majesty in Council shall think fit to do so make an Order for carrying such scheme into effect.

"As witness our hand this tenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred

and eighty and in the eighteenth year of our translation. "W. Ebor."

And whereas the scheme and consents, mentioned in the said report, are in the words and figures following:—

"The SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate the township of Davenport in the parish of Astbury in the county of Chester containing altogether seven hundred and fifty-five acres one rood and thirty perches the boundaries whereof are well known and defined from the said parish of Astbury to which it belongs and to annex it to the parish of Swettenham in the said county of Chester to which it is contiguous for all ecclesiastical purposes of which parish the church of Swettenham shall be the parish church.

"That the rector of the parish of Astbury shall cease to have cure of souls within the said township and the rector of the parish of Swettenham shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within the same.

"That the inhabitants of the said township of Davenport shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the parish church of Astbury or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected in that parish but shall be liable as other inhabitants of the parish of Swettenham to the repair of the parish church of Swettenham and that the said inhabitants of the said township shall have the same rights as to pews and performance of all offices and services of the church at the said parish church of Swettenham and otherwise in relation to the same church and the parish belonging thereto as other inhabitants of the same parish.

"That the fees for such offices and services performed for the inhabitants of the said township as aforesaid or arising within the limits of the same and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the incumbent of the rectory of Swettenham.

"That the tithe rent-charges the particulars of which are given in the schedule hereunder written and payable on land in the said township of Davenport commuted at the annual sum of eighty-five pounds by an award and apportionment of tithe rents charges in lieu of tithe of the said township confirmed by the Tithe Commissioners for England and Wales on the eighteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine which said tithe rents charges have been heretofore payable to the rector of Astbury shall be received by and become payable to the rector of Swettenham aforesaid."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her present Majesty (session 2) chapter twenty-six, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of your Majesty (session 2) chapter twenty-six, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing certain alterations and improvements at the episcopal residence belonging to the See of Canterbury which is situate at Addington in the county of Surrey and is known as Addington Park.

"Whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Archbishop of Canterbury is desirous that certain alterations and improvements should be made at the said episcopal residence known as Addington Park and has submitted to us the particulars of such proposed alterations and improvements and we have approved the same.

"And whereas the said Archbishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the said proposed alterations and improvements a sum of two thousand pounds (being a sum which does not exceed two years' income of the See of Canterbury) should be provided by borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments or endowments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the said See of Canterbury.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Archibald Campbell Archbishop of Canterbury (testified by his having signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that the said Archbishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts the sum of two thousand pounds and that as a security for the same the said Archbishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by deed for the term of thirty-five years or until the said sum of two thousand pounds with the interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in manner following that is to say during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term of thirty-five years computed from the day of the date of the mortgage no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Archbishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one thirtieth part of the said principal sum of two thousand pounds until the whole thereof shall be repaid and shall at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months aforesaid pay interest at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid and if and when it shall happen that the principal and interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us and shall bind not only the said Archibald Campbell now Archbishop of Canterbury but also all his successors in the said See of Canterbury until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England further recommend and propose that

the said sum of two thousand pounds shall be paid to us and that the receipt of our joint treasurers for the time being endorsed on the said mortgage deed shall be a good and sufficient discharge to the said Governors and their successors for the same who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof and that upon the receipt of the said sum of two thousand pounds the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed alterations and improvements at the episcopal residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Archbishop for the time being of Canterbury shall at his personal charge insure against loss or damage by fire and keep insured the said episcopal house of residence known as Addington Park the said insurance to be for a sum of twenty thousand pounds and to be effected in one or more of the public offices of insurance in London or Westminster and that in case of loss or damage by fire to the same house of residence the monies receivable in respect of the said insurance shall be paid over to us by the said Archbishop and shall with any interest or accumulations thereon be applied by us in rebuilding or repairing the same house of residence with the concurrence of the said Archbishop.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury. *C.
