NOTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold a Levee at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Wednesday, the 30th instant, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at this Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

ORDER of the Local Government Board under the District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of District and Duties :—

- Staffordshire and Derbyshire Audit District.
 To William Edward Knollys, of Wrotham, in the County of Kent, Gentleman :—
 To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions and of the Separate Parish named in the Schedules A. and B. to this Order :—
 To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised within the said Unions

respectively, and of the said Separate Parish ;—

To the Surveyor of the Highways for the Highway Parish named in the Schedule C. to this Order ;—

To the other Authorities referred to in Article 2 (Nos. 4 and 5) of this Order ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 9th day of October, 1879, the Local Government Board assigned to William John Bloomfield, of Acton, in the county of Middlesex, Gentleman, who was a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf, a District in which he should act as Auditor, to comprise the several Unions and the separate parish named in the Schedules A. and B. to this Order, and to be termed "The Staffordshire and Derbyshire Audit District ;"

And whereas by an Order dated the 1st day of March, 1880, the Local Government Board ordered and prescribed that it should be the duty of the said William John Bloomfield to audit the accounts of the Surveyor of Highways for the Highway Parish of Apeton and Barton, partly situated within the said Audit District, and of any Collector of Highway Rates appointed by such Surveyor, and that, for the purpose of such Audit, the said Highway Parish should be deemed to be within the said Audit District ;

And whereas the said William John Bloomfield is deceased, and the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the provisions contained in "The District Auditors Act, 1879," above referred to, have, by an Instrument under Seal, bearing date the 2nd day of June, 1880, appointed the said William Edward Knollys to be a District Auditor ;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment of the said William Edward Knollys accordingly, and hereby Order and Prescribe as follows :

ARTICLE 1.—The District in which the said William Edward Knollys shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him, shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the said Schedule A., as well as in the Separate Parish named in the said Schedule B., and in the Highway Parish named in the said Schedule C., such District being termed as aforesaid "The Staffordshire and Derbyshire Audit District."

ARTICLE 2.—It shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers ; namely,—

- (1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the said several Unions, and of the said Separate Parish.
- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions, and of the said Separate Parish.
- (3.) The Surveyor of Highways of the said Highway Parish.
- (4.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within the said Audit District.
- (5.) Such of the said other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be

so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within the said Audit District, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE 3.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority, in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE 4.—Nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with any Audit District formed prior to the passing of the said District Auditors Act, 1879, or the duties and powers of the Auditor of any such District, so far as regards any Audit already commenced by him, or any proceedings in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 5.—In this Order—

The term "Parish" includes any place for which a separate Poor Rate is or can be made or for which a separate Overseer is or can be appointed.

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.
