**N**OTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold a Levee at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Wednesday, the 30th instant, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at this Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

#### REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

#### By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

**W**HEREAS by section 18 of "The Extradition Act, 1870," it is among other things enacted, that if by any Law made after the passing of the said Act by the Legislature of any British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any Foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, either—

- Suspend the operation within any such British Possession of the said Act, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such Foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer;
- Or direct that such Law or Ordinance or any part thereof shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act:

And whereas by an Ordinance enacted by the Legislature of Tobago, the short title of which is, "The Extradition Ordinance, of the Colony of Tobago, 1880," it is provided that "all powers vested in and acts authorized or required to be done by a Police Magistrate or any Justice of the Peace in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals in the United Kingdom under 'The Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873,' are thereby vested in and may in the Colony be exercised and done by any Police Magistrate in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals under the said Acts":

And whereas it is further provided by the said Ordinance that the said Ordinance shall not come into operation until Her Majesty shall, by Order in Council, direct that the said Ordinance shall have effect within the Colony as if it were part of "The Extradition Act, 1870," but that the said Ordinance shall thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council shall have been publicly made known in the Colony.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of "The Extradition Act, 1870," and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained,

doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, direct that the said Ordinance shall have effect in the Colony of Tobago without modification or alteration, as if it were part of "The Extradition Act, 1870."

And the Right Honourable the Earl of Kimberley, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by an Order made by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council on the 10th day of December, 1875, Her Majesty did, by and with the advice of the said Council, order that the Right Honourable John Somerset, Baron Hampton, Grand Cross of the Bath, Sir George Webbe Dasent, Knight, Doctor of Civil Law, and Theodore Walrond, Esquire, Companion of the Bath, or such other persons as Her Majesty might from time to time approve in the stead of them or any of them should be Her Majesty's Commissioners for testing, in conformity with Her Majesty's Order in Council dated the 4th of June, 1870, or such further Order or Orders as Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council had issued, or might issue in that behalf, the qualifications of persons proposed to be appointed to situations or employments in Her Majesty's Civil Establishments, and also for testing in conformity with regulations to be from time to time issued by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for War, the literary qualifications of candidates for first Commissions in the Army, and for admission to the Royal Military College at Woolwich, and should hold their offices during the pleasure of Her Majesty; the said Right Honourable John Somerset, Baron Hampton, being the First Commissioner; and should have power, subject to the approval of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to appoint from time to time such Assistant Examiners and others as might be required to assist them in the duties thereinafter assigned to them:

And whereas since the date of the Order first above mentioned, the said Right Honourable John

Somerset, Baron Hampton, hath departed this life, and whereas it is deemed expedient that George Henry Charles, Baron Strafford (commonly called Viscount Enfield) should be appointed First Commissioner in the place and stead of the said Right Honourable John Somerset, Baron Hampton, but without salary:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said George Henry Charles, Baron Strafford (commonly called Viscount Enfield), the said Sir George Webbe Dasent, Knight, and the said Theodore Walrond, Esquire, or such other persons as Her Majesty may from time to time approve in the stead of them, or any of them, shall be Her Majesty's Commissioners for testing, in conformity with the said Order in Council dated the 4th of June, 1870, or such further Order or Orders as Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, has issued, or may issue in that behalf, the qualifications of persons proposed to be appointed to situations or employments in Her Majesty's Civil Establishments, and also for testing in conformity with regulations to be from time to time issued by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for War, the literary qualifications of candidates for first Commissions in the Army, and for admission to the Royal Military College at Woolwich; and shall hold their offices during the pleasure of Her Majesty: the said George Henry Charles, Baron Strafford (commonly called Viscount Enfield) being the First Commissioner; and shall have power subject to the approval of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to appoint from time to time such Assistant Examiners and others as may be required to assist them in the performance of their duties.

And it is further ordered that the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury shall not prepare or submit to Parliament any estimate for the remuneration of the said First Commissioner.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining

"tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme, in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect; and such Order being registered in the Registry of the Diocese, which the Registrar is hereby required to do, shall be forthwith binding on all persons whatsoever, including the Incumbent or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected thereby, if he or they shall have consented thereto in writing under his or their hands."

And whereas William Lord Archbishop of the Province of York hath in pursuance of the said Act made a report to Her Majesty in Council in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"That there are in the county and diocese of York the parishes of Darrington, Badsworth, Womersley and Kirk Smeaton portions of which said parishes are particularly delineated and described in the map or plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured respectively blue, pink, yellow and green.

"That the population of the said parish of Darrington according to the last census was 679 and the populations of the said parishes of Badsworth, Womersley and Kirk Smeaton according to the same census were respectively 595, 1,070 and 341.

"That the net annual value of the benefice of Darrington is six hundred pounds per annum; that of the benefice of Badsworth is seven hundred and fifty pounds per annum; that of the benefice of Womersley is three hundred and twenty pounds; and that of the benefice of Kirk Smeaton is three hundred and sixty-eight pounds.

"That the Reverend Digby Strangeways Wrangham is the incumbent of the said benefice of Darrington, that the Reverend Frank Edward Hopwood is the incumbent of the said benefice of Badsworth, that the Reverend Joseph Henry Brierley is the incumbent of the said benefice of Womersley, and that the Reverend Robert Wood Shepherd Hicks is the incumbent of the said benefice of Kirk Smeaton.

"That the said William Lord Archbishop of York is the patron of the said benefice of Darrington that the Right Honourable Edward Henry Earl of Derby is the patron of the said benefice of Badsworth that Sir John William Ramsden of Byram in the said county of York Baronet

and John Charlesworth Dodgson Charlesworth of Chapelthorpe Hall in the said county Esquire and the Right Honourable Frances Lady Hawke of Womersley Park in the same county Widow are the patrons of the said benefice of Womersley and that the Right Honourable William Thomas Spencer Earl Fitzwilliam is the patron of the said benefice of Kirk Smeaton.

"That the said incumbents and patrons of the said benefices of Darrington, Badsworth, Womersley and Kirk Smeaton are consenting parties to the separation and annexation hereinafter proposed.

"That a church has been erected at Wentbridge within the proposed new boundaries of the said parish of Darrington for the convenience of the inhabitants of the said portions of the parishes of Badsworth Womersley and Kirk Smeaton.

"That it appears to us that certain portions of the said parishes of Badsworth Womersley and Kirk Smeaton more particularly delineated and described in the scheme and plan hereto annexed may advantageously be separated from those parishes and be united for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish of Darrington.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the before-mentioned Act the said Archbishop has prepared a scheme in writing appended to this report describing the mode in which it appears to him that the said unions and separations may be best effected and how the alterations and changes consequent on such separations and annexations may be best effected with justice to all parties interested. And the said Archbishop being satisfied on full consideration and inquiry with such scheme he doth by this report to your Majesty in Council certify the same to your Majesty together with the consents in writing to the said scheme of the patrons and incumbents of the benefices to be affected to the intent that your Majesty in Council in case it should be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an order for carrying the same into effect.

"As witness the hand of the said Archbishop this fifteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

And whereas the scheme and consents mentioned in the said report are in the words and figures following:—

"The SCHEME hereinbefore referred to.

"That so much of the parish of Badsworth as is delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured round with a pink verge line shall be separated from that parish and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Darrington and that the vicar of the said parish of Darrington shall have exclusive charge of souls over the same.

"That so much of the parish of Womersley as is delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured round with a yellow verge line shall be separated from that parish and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Darrington and that the vicar of the said parish of Darrington shall have exclusive charge of souls over the same.

"That so much of the parish of Kirk Smeaton as is delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured round with a green verge line shall be separated from that parish and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Darrington and that the vicar of the said parish of Darrington shall have exclusive charge of souls over the same.

"That all fees and payments arising from baptisms churchings marriages and all other ecclesi-

astical offices solemnized in respect of such portions of the said parishes of Badsworth, Womersley and Kirk Smeaton as shall be included within the proposed new boundaries of the said parish of Darrington and all such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice in respect of such portions of the parishes of Badsworth, Womersley and Kirk Smeaton shall henceforth belong to and be received by the incumbent of the said vicarage of Darrington.

"That the inhabitants of the said portions of the parishes of Badsworth, Womersley and Kirk Smeaton included within the proposed new boundaries of the parish of Darrington shall be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Dar-

ington aforesaid and also in the said church erected within such proposed new boundaries at Wentbridge.

"That from and after the date hereof the tithes arising out of lands situate within the said parish of Badsworth commuted at the sum of twelve pounds ten shillings belonging to the benefice of Badsworth which said lands and tithes are more particularly described in the schedule hereto annexed shall belong to and become part of the endowment of the said benefice of Darrington for and towards the maintenance of a minister to serve the said church situate at Wentbridge aforesaid.

"That no alteration shall be made in respect of the patronage of the said benefices of Darrington Badsworth Womersley, and Kirk Smeaton.

reciting that "Whereas in some instances, tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and enquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect; and such Order being registered in the Registry of the Diocese, which the Registrar is hereby required to do, shall be forthwith binding on all persons whatsoever, including the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected thereby, if he or they shall have consented thereto in writing under his or their hands."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Hereford hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following that is to say:—

"To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"We the Right Reverend James Lord Bishop of Hereford do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"1. That within the county of Salop and our diocese of Hereford are the vicarage and parish church of Stanton Lacy the parish whereof comprises amongst other places the townships of

'Stanton Lacy' the 'East Hamlets' and 'Rock and Henley.'

"2. That the population of the parish of Stanton Lacy including the townships of Stanton Lacy, the East Hamlets and Rock and Henley is two thousand, the population of the township of Rock and Henley and the parts or portions of the townships of Stanton Lacy and the East Hamlets described and comprised in the schedule hereto being estimated at one thousand three hundred and sixty-five.

"3. That the parish church of Stanton Lacy affords accommodation for five hundred or thereabouts and is distant from the parts of the townships of Stanton Lacy and the East Hamlets described as aforesaid about three miles and from the said township of Rock and Henley about four miles.

"4. That the net annual income of the said vicarage of Stanton Lacy amounts to five hundred and eight pounds or thereabouts.

"5. That within the said county of Salop and our diocese of Hereford are the rectory and parish church of Ludlow.

"6. That the said township of Rock and Henley and the parts or portions of the said townships of Stanton and Lacy and the East Hamlets described as aforesaid although forming part of the said vicarage and parish of Stanton Lacy are in fact close to the parish church of Ludlow and the inhabitants of the said township and portions of townships attend the said parish church of Ludlow.

"7. That the parish of Ludlow contains a population of five thousand and eighty and the churches of the said parish of Ludlow afford accommodation for two thousand or thereabouts.

"8. That the net annual value of the said rectory of Ludlow is three hundred and sixty pounds or thereabouts.

"9. That the patronage of the said vicarage and parish church of Stanton Lacy and of the said rectory and parish church of Ludlow belongs to the Right Honourable Lord Windsor.

"10. That the vicar of the vicarage and parish church of Stanton Lacy is the Reverend Lewis Richard Charles Bagot and the Reverend Edward Farrington Clayton is the rector of the rectory and parish church of Ludlow.

"11. That it appears to us that under the provisions of the Act of Parliament passed in the session holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty cap. 106 'To abridge the holding of Benefices in plurality and to make other provisions for the residence of the Clergy' the said township of Rock and Henley and the said portions of the said townships of Stanton Lacy and East Hamlets may be advantageously separated from the said vicarage and parish of Stanton Lacy and be united to the said rectory and parish of Ludlow for ecclesiastical purposes.

"12. That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Act of Parliament we have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction dues rates and payments and in respect of rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the aforesaid patron and incumbents of the said vicarage and rectory and parish churches respectively to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and inquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme certify the same and

such consents as aforesaid by your report to Her Majesty in Council.

And whereas the scheme and consents referred to in the said representation are in the words and figures following:—

"The SCHEME above referred to.

"1. That the township of Rock and Henley and the portions of the townships of Stanton Lacy and the East Hamlets described in the schedule hereto all at present belonging to and forming part of the vicarage and parish of Stanton Lacy in the county of Salop and diocese of Hereford shall be separated from the said vicarage and parish and be united to and be deemed part of rectory and parish of Ludlow in the said county and diocese for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. That the said township of Rock and Henley and the portions of the townships of Stanton Lacy and the East Hamlets described as aforesaid shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said rectory and parish of Ludlow and the said rector of the said rectory and parish church of Ludlow shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits aforesaid.

"3. That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for marriages churchings burials and other ecclesiastical offices in respect of persons resident within the said township of Rock and Henley and the portions of the said townships of Stanton Lacy and the East Hamlets so described as aforesaid shall belong to the incumbent of Ludlow and that the inhabitants of the said township and portions of townships shall not hereafter be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Stanton Lacy but shall be entitled in common with the inhabitants of the said parish of Ludlow to accommodation in the parish church of Ludlow and shall be exempted from all liability to repair the parish church of Stanton Lacy but shall be liable (subject to the provisions of 'The Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868') to the repair of the said parish church of Ludlow.

"4. That the sum of eleven shillings being a part of the tenths now payable by the vicar of Stanton Lacy shall in future be paid by the rector of Ludlow and that the whole of the tithe rent-charge payable to the said vicar of Stanton Lacy in respect of the township of Rock and Henley and the portions of the townships of Stanton Lacy and the East Hamlets described in the first schedule hereto and which said tithe rent-charge is set forth in the second schedule hereto shall be transferred and in future paid to the said rector of Ludlow.

"The FIRST SCHEDULE above referred to.

"That portion of the township of Stanton Lacy which is bounded by a line commencing at the north-east corner of the field No. 193 on the tithe commutation map of the said township and proceeding in a south-western direction along the northern side of Rock-lane a distance of about forty chains to the road leading from Ludlow to Cainham and along the north side of the said road about eight chains to the point where the said township joins the parish of Saint Lawrence thence in a northerly and westernly direction along the boundary between the said township and the parish of Saint Lawrence crossing the road called Upper Gaolford a distance of about nineteen chains into the Portcullis-lane thence in a northerly direction along the said lane still following the boundary between the said township and the parish of Saint Lawrence crossing the road leading from Sandpits to Corve Bridge and

then still following the said boundary in a westernly direction to the River Corve turning thence in a northerly direction along the course of the River Corve a distance of fifty-three chains thence in an easternly direction along the boundary between the parishes of Stanton Lacy and Bromfield to the road leading from Ludlow to Whitbach thence in a north-eastern direction along the eastern side of the said road a distance of thirteen chains then turning southward along the eastern boundary fences of the fields numbers 161, 160, 159, 158, 162, 163, 164, and 165 on the tithe commutation map of the said township of Stanton Lacy a distance of fifty-four chains into the lane leading to Dodmore thence in an easternly direction a distance of seven chains along the northern fence of numbers 170 and 171 on the said map hence in a northerly and southernly direction round the eastern fences of fields numbers 172 and 171 on the said map to the road leading to Clee Hill thence in a westernly direction along the northern fence of the said road a distance of one chain and a quarter then crossing the said road and proceeding in a southernly direction along the eastern fences of the fields numbers 174, 193 and 192 on the said map to the point first mentioned. Also a detached portion of the township of Stanton Lacy consisting of six fields situate on the eastern bank of the River Teme extending along the course of the said river from its junction with the River Corve in a southernly direction to the road which runs round Ludlow Castle and which said portions of the township of Stanton Lacy are delineated in the map annexed hereto and thereon coloured brown.

"That portion of the township of the East Hamlets which is bounded by a line commencing in the road leading from Ludlow to Whitbach at the point where the boundary of the before-mentioned township of Stanton Lacy crosses the said road and thence in a southerly direction traversing the same line of boundary as before described from that point to the Clee Hill-road then leaving the aforesaid boundary line and proceeding in an easterly direction along the northern fence of the said road a distance of seven chains then turning north about half a chain to the southern fence of field numbered 109 on the tithe commutation map of the township of the East Hamlets thence in an easternly direction along the southern fences of fields numbers 109, 103, 105, 102, and 101, to the occupation road to Dodmore thence still in an easternly direction crossing the field number 79, to the southern fence of field number 78, on the said map and still following the same line of fence to the south-eastern corner of field number 77 on the said map thence in a northerly direction following the boundary between the said township and the parish of Bitterley along the eastern fences of fields numbers 77, 76, 73, part 69 and 68, on the said map thence in a westernly direction along the northern fences of fields numbers 68, 67, 66, 65, 55, 56, and 57, to the point before mentioned in the road leading to Whitbach and which said portion of the township of the East Hamlets is delineated in the plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink.

"The SECOND SCHEDULE above referred to.

“We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council that the Right Reverend James Lord Bishop of Hereford has represented unto us (amongst other things):—

“That within the county of Salop and diocese of Hereford are the vicarage and parish church of Stanton Lacy the parish whereof comprises amongst other places the townships of ‘Stanton Lacy’ the ‘East Hamlets’ and ‘Rock and Henley.’

“That the parish church of Stanton Lacy is

distant from certain parts of the townships of Stanton Lacy and the East Hamlets in the representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop particularly referred to about three miles and from the said township of Rock and Henley about four miles.

“That within the said county of Salop and diocese of Hereford are the rectory and parish church of Ludlow.

“That the said townships of Rock and Henley and the said parts of the townships of Stanton Lacy and the East Hamlets are close to the parish church of Ludlow and the inhabitants of the said township and portions of townships attend the said parish church of Ludlow.

“That the patronage of the said vicarage and parish church of Stanton Lacy and of the said rectory and parish church of Ludlow belongs to the Right Honourable Lord Windsor.

“That the vicar of the vicarage and parish church of Stanton Lacy is the Reverend Lewis Richard Charles Bagot and the Reverend Edward ffarington Clayton is the rector of the rectory and parish church of Ludlow.

“That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said township of Rock and Henley and the said portions of the said townships of Stanton Lacy and East Hamlets may under the provisions of the Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of your Majesty's reign cap. 106 be advantageously separated from the said parish of Stanton Lacy and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish of Ludlow.

“That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction dues rates and payments and in respect of rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patron and the incumbents of the benefices to be affected has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

“The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

“And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of your Majesty's reign cap 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

“And whereas one part of the endowments of the said benefice of Old Warden consists of certain lands and hereditaments comprising forty-five acres or thereabouts in extent which are situate at Riseley in the said county of Bedford.

“And whereas the said Samuel Whitbread has represented to us and we are of opinion that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the parish of Southill by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Old Warden which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas by an indenture already prepared and intended to be executed immediately after the publication in the London Gazette of this scheme and any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and to bear date the day of the date of such publication as aforesaid and made between the said Henry Edward Earl of Ilchester of the one part and the Right Reverend George by Divine permission Lord Bishop of Salisbury of the other part the perpetual advowson donation and right of patronage and presentation of in and to the said rectory of West Grimstead or Grinstead in the said county of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury is intended and

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the disposal of certain benefices in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Ely.

"Whereas the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church of Ely have under the authority of the said Act submitted to us certain proposals under their common seal to which proposals the approval of the Right Reverend James Russell Bishop of Ely, and as such Bishop Visitor of the same cathedral church has been given.

"And whereas the same proposals and the schedule in the same proposals, mentioned and the approval given by the said Bishop are respectively in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"Proposals made by the Dean and Chapter of Ely under 3 and 4 Victoria, cap. 113 section 47 to the Lord Bishop of Ely as Visitor for certain alterations in their existing statutes and rules with the view of providing for the disposal of certain benefices in their patronage so as to meet the just claims of the minor canons of the Cathedral Church of Ely.

"We the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Undivided Trinity in Ely make the following proposals to your Lordship as Visitor, that is to say:—

"1. That the benefices seven in number which are specified in the schedule hereunto annexed being all of them benefices in our patronage as the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church of Ely and being all them benefices beyond

the limits of six miles from the said cathedral church, shall be set apart for the benefit of the minor canons of the said cathedral church who shall have served in that office for not less than five years (according to the provisions of 3 and 4 Victoria c. 113 sec. 44) and being benefices to which to the exclusion of all other benefices in our patronage the minor canons for the time being of the said cathedral church who shall have served in that office for not less than five years as aforesaid shall have a claim (and that in order of seniority of appointment) to be nominated and presented and that upon any and every such vacancy in the said seven benefices and each of them which shall happen on or at any time after the day on which an Order of Her Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette we the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church of Ely shall nominate and present to the benefice so vacant such one of the then minor canons (who shall have served in that office for not less than five years) as shall in order of seniority of his appointment within a time to be fixed by us claim in writing under his hand to be nominated and presented to such benefice.

"2. That it shall not be imperative on us the said Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church of Ely to nominate and present to any one of the said seven benefices, any minor canon qualified as aforesaid who in our judgment shall not be a fit and proper person to discharge the parochial ministration of such benefice, and that in every case in which we may act upon this proviso, the minor canon who may be affected by our so doing may appeal to your Lordship as Visitor of the said Cathedral Church of Ely and shall and also we the said Dean and Chapter shall be bound by your Lordship's decision upon such appeal which shall be final.

"3.
