

**The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.**

In the County Court of Cheshire, holden at Birkenhead. In the Matter of George Hamilton, of No. 4, Park-grove, Whetstone-lane, Birkenhead, in the county of Chester, School Proprietor, a Bankrupt.
