PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made in pursuance of the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862, and dated the ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, Her Majesty was pleased to direct:— First, that the Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Act should be modified by the substitution for such Regulations of certain Regulations appended to the said Order:

Secondly, that the said Regulations appended to the said Order should, on and after the first day of June one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, apply to French ships, whether within British jurisdiction or not:

And whereas, by several Orders in Council subsequently made, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the Regulations appended to the said Order of the ninth of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three should apply to ships of the countries specified in the said Orders, whether within British jurisdiction or not.

And whereas, by Order in Council dated the thirtieth day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, Her Majesty, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, was pleased to make certain additions to the Regulations appended to the said first-recited Order in Council, for the purpose of explaining Articles 11 and 13 of the said Regulations, and of removing doubt and misapprehension concerning the effect of the said two Articles:

And whereas, by Order in Council dated the fourteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, Her Majesty has been pleased to direct that on and after the first day of September one thousand eight hundred and eighty the said Regulations and the additions thereto shall be annulled, and that there should be substituted therefor, the New Regulations contained in the First Schedule thereto, and that the same shall from and after the said first day of September one thousand eight hundred and eighty apply to ships of the countries mentioned in the Second Schedule thereto, whether within British jurisdiction or not:

And whereas it has been made to appear to

Her Majesty that the following Governments; that is to say,

The Government of Khelat;  
 " " Muscat;  
 " " Zanzibar;  
 " " Cochin;  
 " " Travancore;  
 " " Kutch; and  
 " " Kattyawar,

are willing that from and after the said first day of September one thousand eight hundred and eighty the said New Regulations, a copy whereof is hereunto appended, contained in the First Schedule of the said recited Order in Council of the fourteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine shall, with the exception of Article 10 thereof, apply to ships belonging to their respective countries when beyond the limits of British jurisdiction:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said recited Act, and by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct:

That from and after the first day of September one thousand eight hundred and eighty the said New Regulations for preventing collisions at sea, a copy whereof is hereunto appended, contained in the First Schedule of the said recited Order in Council of the fourteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine shall, with the exception of Article 10 thereof, apply to ships belonging to the following countries; that is to say,

Khelat;  
 Muscat;  
 Zanzibar;  
 Cochin;  
 Travancore;  
 Kutch; and  
 Kattyawar,

whether within British jurisdiction or not.

REGULATIONS for Preventing Collisions at Sea referred to in the foregoing Orders.

*Preliminary.*

ART. 1. In the following rules every steam ship which is under sail and not under steam is to be considered a sailing ship; and every steam ship which is under steam, whether under sail or not, is to be considered a ship under steam.

*Rules concerning Lights.*

ART. 2. The lights mentioned in the following Articles, numbered 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11,

and no others, shall be carried in all weathers, from sunset to sunrise.

ART. 3. A seagoing steam ship when under way shall carry—

(a.) On or in front of the foremast, at a height above the hull of not less than 20 feet, and if the breadth of the ship exceeds 20 feet then at a height above the hull of not less than such breadth, a bright white light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 20 points of the compass; so fixed as to throw the light 10 points on each side of ship, viz., from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on either side; and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least five miles.

(b.) On the starboard side, a green light so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass; so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the starboard side; and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.

(c.) On the port side, a red light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass; so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the port side; and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.

(d.) The said green and red side lights shall be fitted with inboard screens projecting at least three feet forward from the light, so as to prevent these lights from being seen across the bow.

ART. 4. A steam ship, when towing another ship, shall, in addition to her side lights, carry two bright white lights in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart, so as to distinguish her from other steam ships. Each of these lights shall be of the same construction and character, and shall be carried in the same position as the white light which other steam ships are required to carry.

ART. 5. A ship, whether a steam ship or a sailing ship, when employed either in laying or in picking up a telegraph cable, or which from any accident is not under command, shall at night carry, in the same position as the white light which steam ships are required to carry, and, if a steam ship, in place of that light, three red lights in globular lanterns, each not less than 10 inches in diameter, in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart; and shall by day carry in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart, in front of but not lower than her foremast head, three black balls or shapes, each two feet in diameter.

These shapes and lights are to be taken by approaching ships as signals that the ship using them is not under command, and cannot therefore get out of the way.

The above ships, when not making any way through the water shall not carry the side lights, but when making way shall carry them.

ART. 6. A sailing ship under way, or being towed, shall carry the same lights as are provided by Article 3 for a steam ship under way, with the exception of the white light, which she shall never carry.

ART. 7. Whenever, as in the case of small vessels during bad weather, the green and red side lights cannot be fixed, these lights shall be kept on deck, on their respective sides of the vessel, ready for use; and shall, on the approach of or to other vessels, be exhibited on their respective sides in sufficient time to prevent collision, in such manner as to make them most visible, and so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side nor the red light on the starboard side.

To make the use of these portable lights more certain and easy, the lanterns containing them shall each be painted outside with the colour of the light they respectively contain, and shall be provided with proper screens.

ART. 8. A ship, whether a steam ship or a sailing ship, when at anchor, shall carry, where it can best be seen, but at a height not exceeding 20 feet above the hull, a white light, in a globular lantern of not less than eight inches in diameter, and so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon, at a distance of at least one mile.

ART. 9. A pilot vessel, when engaged on her station on pilotage duty, shall not carry the lights required for other vessels, but shall carry a white light at the masthead, visible all round the horizon, and shall also exhibit a flare-up light or flare-up lights at short intervals, which shall never exceed fifteen minutes.

A pilot vessel, when not engaged on her station on pilotage duty, shall carry lights similar to those of other ships.

ART. 10. (a.) *Open fishing boats and other open boats when under way shall not be obliged to carry the side lights required for other vessels; but every such boat shall in lieu thereof have ready at hand a lantern with a green glass on the one side and a red glass on the other side; and on the approach of or to other vessels, such lantern shall be exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision, so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side, nor the red light on the starboard side.*

(b.) *A fishing vessel, and an open boat, when at anchor, shall exhibit a bright white light.*

(c.) *A fishing vessel, when employed in drift net fishing, shall carry on one of her masts two red lights in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart.*

(d.) *A trawler at work shall carry on one of her masts two lights in a vertical line one over the other; not less than three feet apart, the upper light red, and the lower green, and shall also either carry the side lights required for other vessels, or, if the side lights cannot be carried, have ready at hand the coloured lights as provided in Article 7, or a lantern with a red and a green glass as described in paragraph (a.) of this Article.*

(e.) *Fishing vessels and open boats shall not be prevented from using a flare-up in addition, if they desire to do so.*

(f.) *The lights mentioned in this Article are substituted for those mentioned in the 12th, 13th, and 14th Articles of the Convention between France and England scheduled to the British Sea Fisheries Act, 1868.*

(g.) *All lights required by this Article, except side lights, shall be in globular lanterns so constructed as to show all round the horizon.*

ART. 10. This Article does not apply to fishing boats, open boats, or trawlers belonging to the several countries mentioned in the foregoing Order, viz.: Kelat, Muscat, Zanzibar, Travancore, Kutch, and Kattyawar.

ART. 11. A ship which is being overtaken by another shall show from her stern to such last-mentioned ship a white light or a flare-up light.

*Sound Signals for Fog, &c.*

ART. 12. A steam ship shall be provided with a steam whistle or other efficient steam sound signal, so placed that the sound may not be intercepted by any obstructions, and with an efficient fog horn to be sounded by a bellows or other mechanical means, and also with an efficient bell. A sailing ship shall be provided with a similar fog horn and bell.

In fog, mist, or falling snow, whether by day or night, the signals described in this Article shall be used as follows; that is to say,

- (a.) A steam ship under way shall make with her steam whistle, or other steam sound signal, at intervals of not more than two minutes, a prolonged blast.
- (b.) A sailing ship under way shall make with her fog horn, at intervals of not more than two minutes, when on the starboard tack one blast, when on the port tack two blasts in succession, and when with the wind abaft the beam three blasts in succession.
- (c.) A steam ship and a sailing ship, when not under way, shall at intervals of not more than two minutes ring the bell.

*Speed of Ships to be moderate in Fog, &c.*

ART. 13. Every ship, whether a sailing ship or steam ship, shall, in a fog, mist, or falling snow, go at a moderate speed.

*Steering and Sailing Rules.*

ART. 14. When two sailing ships are approaching one another, so as to involve risk of collision, one of them shall keep out of the way of the other, as follows, viz.

- (a.) A ship which is running free shall keep out of the way of a ship which is close-hauled.
- (b.) A ship which is close-hauled on the port tack shall keep out of the way of a ship which is close-hauled on the starboard tack.
- (c.) When both are running free with the wind on different sides, the ship which has the wind on the port side shall keep out of the way of the other.
- (d.) When both are running free with the wind on the same side, the ship which is to windward shall keep out of the way of the ship which is to leeward.
- (e.) A ship which has the wind aft shall keep out of the way of the other ship.

ART. 15. If two ships under steam are meeting end on, or nearly end on, so as to involve risk of collision, each shall alter her course to starboard, so that each may pass on the port side of the other.

This Article only applies to cases where ships are meeting end on, or nearly end on, in such a manner as to involve risk of collision, and does not apply to two ships which must, if both keep on their respective courses, pass clear of each other.

The only cases to which it does apply are, when each of the two ships is end on, or nearly end on, to the other: in other words, to cases in which, by day, each ship sees the masts of the other in a line, or nearly in a line, with her own; and by night to cases in which each ship is in such a position as to see both the side lights of the other.

It does not apply by day, to cases in which a ship sees another ahead crossing her own course; or by night, to cases where the red

light of one ship is opposed to the red light of the other, or where the green light of one ship is opposed to the green light of the other, or where a red light without a green light, or a green light without a red light, is seen ahead, or where both green and red lights are seen anywhere but ahead.

ART. 16. If two ships under steam are crossing, so as to involve risk of collision, the ship which has the other on her own starboard side shall keep out of the way of the other.

ART. 17. If two ships, one of which is a sailing ship and the other a steam ship, are proceeding in such directions as to involve risk of collision, the steam ship shall keep out of the way of the sailing ship.

ART. 18. Every steam ship when approaching another ship, so as to involve risk of collision, shall slacken her speed or stop and reverse, if necessary.

ART. 19. In taking any course authorized or required by these regulations, a steam ship under way may indicate that course to any other ship which she has in sight by the following signals on her steam whistle, viz.:

One short blast to mean "I am directing my course to starboard":

Two short blasts to mean "I am directing my course to port":

Three short blasts to mean "I am going full speed astern."

The use of these signals is optional; but if they are used, the course of the ship must be in accordance with the signal made.

ART. 20. Notwithstanding anything contained in any preceding Article, every ship, whether a sailing ship or a steam ship, overtaking any other, shall keep out of the way of the overtaken ship.

ART. 21. In narrow channels every steam ship shall, when it is safe and practicable, keep to that side of the fairway or mid-channel which lies on the starboard side of such ship.

ART. 22. Where by the above rules one of two ships is to keep out the way, the other shall keep her course.

ART. 23. In obeying and construing these rules due regard shall be had to all dangers of navigation; and to any special circumstances which may render a departure from the above rules necessary in order to avoid immediate danger.

*No Ship under any circumstances to neglect proper Precautions.*

ART. 24. Nothing in these rules shall exonerate any ship, or the owner, or master, or crew thereof, from the consequences of any neglect to carry lights or signals, or of any neglect to keep a proper look-out, or of the neglect of any precaution which may be required by the ordinary practice of seamen, or by the special circumstances of the case.

*Reservation of Rules for Harbours and Inland Navigation.*

ART. 25. Nothing in these rules shall interfere with the operation of a special rule, duly made by local authority, relative to the navigation of any harbour, river, or inland navigation.

*Special Lights for Squadrons and Convoys.*

ART. 26. Nothing in these rules shall interfere with the operation of any special rules made by the Government of any nation with respect to additional station and signal lights for two or more ships of war or for ships sailing under convoy.

**W**HEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that Her Majesty may, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time reduce all or any of the dues for the time being payable in respect of existing or future lighthouses, buoys, or beacons under the management of the General Lighthouse Authorities; and may also, by and with the like advice, from time to time increase or vary such dues:

And whereas, by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, Her Majesty was pleased to approve certain revised and amended New Consolidated Tables of Light Duties (Oversea Section) levied by the said General Lighthouse Authorities respectively in the form thereunto annexed, together with the several reductions, variations, abatements, regulations, and exemptions therein contained:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, Her Majesty was pleased to approve certain New Consolidated Tables of Light Duties (Coast Section) levied as aforesaid in the form thereunto annexed, together with the several reductions, variations, abatements, regulations, and exemptions therein contained:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that on and after the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, the duties for all general passing lights under the management of the said General Lighthouse Authorities should be payable by coasting vessels once only for the whole voyage out and home, subject however to the abatement or discount thereinafter mentioned:

And whereas, by various Orders in Council since made in pursuance of the said Act, in respect of certain new lights, certain tolls have been directed to be paid for oversea vessels and for coasting vessels respectively, subject to a certain abatement or discount, and the regulations and exemptions mentioned in the said New Consolidated Tables of Light Duties, and the said Order in Council of the ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that on and after the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, all coasting vessels and all vessels trading between ports in the United Kingdom and ports in Europe (excepting ports in the Mediterranean) should (instead of making one payment of dues for the voyage out and home) be liable in respect of every light passed or from which benefit might be derived, either on the voyage out or on the voyage home, to one moiety of the dues as provided in the said New Consolidated Tables of Light Duties for each general passing light and for each local light under the management of the said General Lighthouse Authorities, subject however to the abatement or discount thereinafter mentioned:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that on and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, the abate-

ment or discount to be allowed upon the amount of light duties should be fifty-five per centum, and no more.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is expedient that the said duties should be varied in the manner hereinafter stated in so far as relates to Home Trade ships, that is to say, to ships trading or going between the United Kingdom, the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Sark, Alderney and Man, and the Continent of Europe between the River Elbe and Brest inclusive, and that such ships should be treated in the matter of light duties in the same manner as coasting vessels:

And whereas it has also been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is expedient that the said abatement or discount of fifty-five per centum on the amount of all the tolls hereinbefore referred to should be varied in manner hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct

1. That on and after the the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, vessels trading or going as aforesaid between the United Kingdom, the islands aforesaid, and the Continent of Europe between the River Elbe and Brest inclusive shall, as respects such Lights as would be chargeable on coasting vessels passing them, be liable to Light Duties at the same rates (subject to the same abatements) as coasting vessels, and to no other.
2. That on and after the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, the abatement or discount to be allowed upon the amount of tolls specified in the said New Consolidated Tables of Light Duties mentioned in the said Orders in Council of the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and upon the amount of tolls specified in the said other Orders in Council hereinbefore referred to, and in this Order in Council, shall, in the case of every oversea vessel and of every coasting vessel, be sixty per centum, and no more. *C. **W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words following; that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly

lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Peter situate at Scorton, in the parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church Town in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Peter situate at Scorton aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church Town which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Peter situate at Scorton as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter Scorton.'

"And with the like consent of the said James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials, should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Peter situate at Scorton as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Scorton, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church Town in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on part of the south-east by the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Calder Vale in the county and diocese aforesaid on the north-east by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Mark Dolphinholme in the same county and diocese on the north-west and on the north partly by the last-named consolidated chapelry partly by the new parish of Saint Paul Shireshead and partly by the parish of Cockerham both in the county and diocese aforesaid on the west by the new parish of Saint Luke Winmarleigh in the said county and diocese and on all other sides that is to say on the south and on the remaining part of the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Luke Winmarleigh from the parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church

Town aforesaid at a point where the road leading from Cockerham to Garstang is joined by by Snape Wood-lane; and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of forty-eight chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-named lane to its junction with the Garstang and Heiring Syke Trust-road; and extending thence southward along the middle of the said trust-road for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Gubberford-lane; and extending thence first eastward, then northward, and then again eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of thirty-two chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the River Wyre at Gubberford Bridge) to the point a little to the east of the said bridge where the last-named lane is joined by the roadway leading past the houses called or known respectively as 'Woodacre Hall' and as 'Woodacre Railway Cottages' to the house called or known as 'Crossey Yeat' and extending thence (that is from the said Gubberford-lane) first south-eastward then north-eastward and then again south-eastward along the middle of the last-described roadway for a distance of one mile and eight chains or thereabouts to its junction at or near to the house called or known as 'Crossey Yeat' aforesaid with the road leading from Backhouse-lane past the house called or known as Crossey Yeat aforesaid to Higher-lane and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to a point at the ford and foot-bridge where the same road crosses the stream called or known as 'Grizedale Beck or Brook' upon the boundary which divides the township of Barnacre-with-Bonds in the said parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church Town from the township of Nether Wyresdale in the same parish; and extending thence north-eastward along the said township boundary for a distance of fifty-nine chains or thereabouts (thereby passing along Grizedale) to the point where the same township boundary joins the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Helen Garstang, otherwise called or known as Church Town, from the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Calder Vale aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifth day of August, in the year

one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

“ We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the parish of Rotherfield in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester.

“ Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of Rotherfield which includes within its limits the hamlet or place called or known as Crowborough and which is hereinafter more particularly mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate district in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“ And whereas there is not within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

“ And whereas the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales acting in pursuance of the Endowed School Acts 1869, 1873 and 1874 or some of them have by a scheme bearing date the twenty-third day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven and approved by your Majesty in Council on the day of the same date, appointed and constituted a Governing Body to administer the foundation known as Sir Henry Fermor's Charity or Charities at Crowborough aforesaid, and to partition and appropriate the endowment of the same foundation to the uses specified in such scheme; and the said Charity Commissioners have by the same scheme directed that part of the endowment aforesaid shall be appropriated to ecclesiastical uses and that with this intent the said Governing Body shall as soon as conveniently may be and under the direction of the said Charity Commissioners take all proper steps for severing all such part of the endowment aforesaid from the said foundation, and for settling the same part to ecclesiastical uses so that it may belong to and form part of the endowment of any ecclesiastical benefice formed or to be formed including within its limits the hamlet or place called or known as Crowborough aforesaid.

“ And whereas the said endowment so to be appropriated for ecclesiastical uses will consist of an annual sum of not less than fifty pounds sterling and will also consist of a house of residence with certain land thereto adjacent the joint annual value of which house and land is estimated at forty pounds or thereabouts.

“ And whereas by a certain deed or indenture bearing date the eighth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty and made or expressed to be made under the provisions of ‘ The New Parishes Acts 1843, 1844 and 1856 ’ or some or one of them, between the Reverend Alfred Child, Clerk in Holy Orders, rector of the rectory of the said parish of Rotherfield of the first part, the Most Honourable William Marquis of Abergavenny the patron of the same rectory, of the second part; the Right Reverend Richard, Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester of the third part, and as the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners of the fourth part (which deed or indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of your Majesty's High Court of Justice)

the said Alfred Child did grant and confirm unto the minister of the said proposed district, (intended as is mentioned in the said deed or indenture to be named ‘ The District of All Saints, Crowborough ’) so soon as a minister shall have been appointed and licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the same Act then to the incumbent of such new parish one clear yearly rent-charge or sum of one hundred pounds to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon the endowments of the rectory of Rotherfield aforesaid.

“ And whereas the said rent-charge or sum of one hundred pounds per annum has been so granted and confirmed as aforesaid upon the understanding that we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England should out of the common fund created by the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act pay to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as aforesaid a grant of twenty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence per annum and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

“ And whereas the said annual grant of twenty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence will be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

“ Now therefore with the consent of the said Richard, Bishop of the diocese of Chichester aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Rotherfield containing within its limits the hamlet or place called or known as Crowborough as aforesaid, all which part of such parish is more particularly described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘ The District of All Saints Crowborough.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and become absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William Marquis of Abergavenny and by his heirs and assigns for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures

relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“The District of All Saints Crowborough, being :—

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory proposed to be annexed to the new parish of Saint John Southall Green in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London being :
