They talk high, nothing less than the retaking of Belgrade: But should this Army be routed, they are utterly lost, and deable to fit out another; any, if they are kept but at a stay, and spend this Summer without any successful Enterprize, they must be forced to make a Peace in Winter upon any Terms; the want of Money being so great, and the extraordinary Taxon lay d this year, so heavy upon the People, that it will endanger a general Revolt to go about to levy them again the next year. And the bad Money, they have introduced soften a gap, and pay the Soldiers, will, in a short time, suitable Commerce, for with one Dollars worth of Copper they coyn so Dollars, so that in a short time we shall see no other Money but that, and the French will not fail to bring it in plentifully; and the sews here coyn all their Kerties and Dishes into Money. Madrid, Sept. 7. On the 27th past arrived here an Express from the Duke de Villa Hermofa, Vicetoy of Catalonia; who brought the following Account; That the French Forces, under the Command of the Duke de Noailles, advanced, on the 20th of the last month to fuecor Campredon, and posted themselves on a Hill in light of our Army; the Scienation of the Ground being very advantageous for them, and fome of our Troops lying very much exposed to their Cannon. The next day the Enemies Right Wing attackt one of our Quarters, but were repulled with the loss of 500 of their Foot, slain upon the place; and at the fame time four of our Squadrons defeatad eight of theirs, most of them being killed with their Lieutenant-General and several other Officer of Note, and divers taken Priloners; and the self setired in great disorder abandoning all their Artillery, Ammunition, Provisions, and Baggage. On openio we lost a Commissary General, and two Cutting of Hosse were wounded, and about These hundres Soldiers hilled and wounded. Three days after

the Fatmy shandoned Campredon in the night, least ving the Cannon nailed ap, and all their Provisions and Ammunition behind them. Our Troopsentred immediately into the place, where they found feveral Mines out. of which they took the Powder, but one or two that were not discovered time enough had effect, and blew up part of the Castle.
