THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order, bearing date the thirteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, defining a part of the Port of Barrowin-Furness, in the county of Lancaster, as a foreign animals wharf: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Barrowin-Furness, in the county of Lancaster, as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space in the borough of Barrow-in-Furness situate on the south side of the Lock and Basin of the Ramsden Dock, commencing at a point at the water edge of the Fifth Jetty about six hundred and seventy-five feet from the west wing wall of the said Basin, thence in a southerly direction for one hundred and ten feet or thereabouts bounded by a wooden fence, thence in an easterly direction for ninety feet or thereabouts bounded by a close wooden fence, thence in a northerly direction for one hundred and ten feet or thereabouts bounded by a wooden fence, thence of the fitteen feet or thereabouts along the water edge of the Sixth Jetty, thence in a southerly direction

bounded by a wooden fence, thence in an easterly direction for three hundred and eighty feet or thereabouts bounded by the wall of the Cattle Lairs, Slaughter-house, and a close wooden fence, thence in a southerly direction for two hundred and thirty-five feet or thereabouts bounded by a close wooden fence, thence in a westerly direction for one hundred and sixty feet or thereabouts bounded by a close wooden fence, thence in a northerly direction for twenty-five feet or thereabouts bounded by the wall of the Chill Room, thence in a westerly direction for one hundred and ninety feet or thereabouts bounded by the wall of the Chill Room Engine and Boilerhouse, thence in a southerly direction for twentyfive feet or thereabouts bounded by the wall of the said Boiler-house, thence in a westerly direction for one hundred and thirty feet or thereabouts bounded by a close wooden fence, thence in a northerly direction for two hundred feet or thereabouts bounded by the Iron Grain Shed, thence in an easterly direction for twenty feet or thereabouts bounded by a close wooden fence, thence in a northerly direction for one hundred and ten feet or thereabouts bounded by a close wooden fence to the water edge of the said Fifth Jetty, thence for fifteen feet or thereabouts along the water edge of the said Fifth Jetty to the point first mentioned, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the Barrow Docks deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Barrow-in-C. L. Peel. Furness.
