2nd Punjab Cavalry—1 sergeant and havildar, 2 rank and file wounded. Total 3. 5 horses wounded.

19th Bengal Lancers—2 rank and file killed; 1 sergeant and havildar, 1 horse killed, 3 wounded, 7 rank and file wounded. Total 10.

Staff—1 British Officer wounded. Total 1. Captain Barrow, 10th Bengal Lancers, A.D.C. to Major-General Hills, V.C., C.B., accompanied Brigadier-General Palliser, C.B., as Galloper, and had his horse wounded also.

Total—1 sergeant and havildar, 2 rank and file killed; 1 British Officer, 3 sergeants and havildars, 25 rank and file wounded. Total 32. Total horses killed 8, wounded 25.

Grand Total—3 killed, 29 wounded. Total 32.
