2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

### PART I.

#### *Area Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.*

An area comprising so much of the Croydon Petty Sessional Division of the county of Surrey as lies within the following roads or highways (namely),—the high road leading from London to Sutton, Morden-lane, Upper Morden-lane, and Green-lane.

### PART II.

#### *Place Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease situate within the foregoing Area.*

The farm premises and park known as Ravensbury Park, in the occupation of George Parker Bidder, and situate in the Croydon Petty Sessional Division of the county of Surrey.

The following place declared, by Order of Council dated the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, to be a place infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—A shed, mentioned in the declaration of the existence of pleuro-pneumonia, dated the fourteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, made by George Carr, of Knaresborough, an Inspector appointed by the Local Authority for the West Riding of the county of York, and situate in the park known as Studley Royal Park, situate in the township of Lindrick-with-Studley-Royal-and-Fountains, in the Kirkby Malzeard Petty Sessional Division of the said West Riding, —is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

3. The following area declared, by Order of Council dated the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, to be an area infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—An area comprising the whole of the park known as Studley Royal Park, the property of the Marquis of Ripon, and situate in the township of Lindrick-with-Studley-Royal-and-Fountains, in the Kirkby Malzeard Petty Sessional Division of the West Riding of the county of York,—is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

*Board of Trade (Harbour Department),  
Whitehall Gardens, November 2, 1880.*

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of an Extract from the Journal Officiel, containing a Decree of the French Republic for the establishment of Tonnage Dues at Cherbourg, Dieppe, La Rochelle, and La Palice. A translation of the Extract is appended, viz.:—

**CHERBOURG.**

ART. 1. From January 1, 1881, there will be established at the Port of Cherbourg (Manche) a tonnage duty of 30 centimes per ton of measurement (tonneau de jauge) on all ships entering with cargo or to take on board cargo, whatever be the wharf or dock to which they resort.

This duty will be reduced to 15 centimes per ton for ships of less than 100 tons as well as for ships performing a regular service between Cherbourg and a foreign port, and not exclusively employed in taking passengers.

The following will be exempt from all tonnage dues: vessels belonging to the State, boats employed for pilotage, towing, coasting between French ports, barges, boats used for fishing (great or small), vessels used exclusively for carrying passengers, yachts and pleasure boats, ships touching at the port without doing any trading, and finally ships that enter in ballast if they leave without cargo.

ART. 2. The collecting of tonnage duties is granted to the Chamber of Commerce of the town of Cherbourg, in order that the proceeds may be exclusively employed to meet the expenses of the subvention of 250,000 francs which the town has engaged itself to furnish to the State by a decision of the Town Council of November 6, 1878.

This collecting will cease immediately after the product of the tonnage duties shall have reached, in capital and interest, the sum needful to pay off the said subvention.

ART. 3. The Minister of Agriculture and of Commerce, the Minister of Public Works, and the Minister of the Interior are charged, each in his own department, with the execution of this Decree.

**DIEPPE.**

ART. 1. The duty on tonnage established at the Port of Dieppe by the Decree of November 14,

1874, will continue to be collected to the profit of the Chamber of Commerce in that town, to be exclusively applied to the work of improving the harbour, the public utility of which has been declared by the Law of April 3rd, 1880.

ART. 2. The collecting of the duty on tonnage will cease immediately after the product has reached the sum necessary for the complete repayment (capital and interest) of the sum spent by the Chamber of Commerce of Dieppe for the payment:—

1. Of half the indemnities of expropriation of land in the suburb of Le Pollet.

2. Of a subvention equal to the difference between 1,500,000 fr. and a half of the charge which shall ultimately be fixed as the proportion in the said indemnities to be borne by the Chamber of Commerce, the town, and the department respectively.

ART. 3. The Minister of Agriculture and of Commerce, the Minister of Public Works, and the Minister of Finance are charged, each in his own department, with the execution of this decree.

**LA ROCHELLE.**

ART. 1. From January 1, 1881, there will be established at the port of La Rochelle (Charente Inférieure) a tonnage duty of 25 centimes per ton of measurement (tonneau de jauge) on all ships entering in cargo or to take cargo on board in the port of La Rochelle, and the new port of La Palice.

From this duty are exempted small fishing vessels, towing and pilot boats, barges and coasting boats between French ports, ships of all kinds belonging to the State, ships calling without trading, and those which, entering in ballast, leave in ballast.

ART. 2. The collecting of this duty is conceded to the Chamber of Commerce of La Rochelle, that the proceeds may be placed in the Municipal Treasury, to be devoted exclusively to the repayment, in capital and interest, of the loan which the town of La Rochelle was authorized to contract by the Law of July 30, 1880.

The collecting of tonnage duty will cease immediately after the product shall have reached the sum necessary for this repayment.

ART. 3. The Minister of Agriculture and of Commerce, the Minister of Public Works, and the Minister of the Interior are charged, each in his own department, with the execution of this Decree.

"Where the accounts of the receipts and expenditure of a Local Authority are audited by a District Auditor, the Local Authority shall prepare and submit to the District Auditor at every audit (other than an extraordinary audit, held in pursuance of Section 6 of the Poor Law Amendment Act, 1866,) a Financial Statement in duplicate in the prescribed form and containing the prescribed particulars ; one of such duplicates shall have the stamp charged under this Act affixed thereon, and the Auditor at the conclusion of the audit shall cancel that stamp, and certify on each duplicate, in the prescribed Form, the amount in words at length of the expenditure so audited and allowed, and further, that the regulations with respect to such Statement have been duly complied with, and that he has ascertained by the audit the correctness of the Statement."

And whereas the Commissioners for Public Libraries and Museums are Local Authorities within the terms of the said Section :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby Order and Prescribe as follows :

The Financial Statement to be prepared and submitted to the District Auditor in duplicate by the Commissioners for Public Libraries and

Museums, as such Local Authorities, in accordance with the provisions of the Section above recited, shall be in the Form in the Schedule to this Order, and shall contain the particulars therein specified; and the Certificate of the District Auditor to be appended to each such duplicate shall be in the Form set forth at the foot of the said Statement.
