the Colledge of Cardinals, notifying the Popes Death; wherein he defires them not to proceed to an Election till they had heard what the Duke *de Cleanlnes* his Ambaffador would propose to them. The Prince of Lichrenstein is coming hither in the fame Quality from the Emperor; And the Palace of the Cardinal *de Medecn* is preparing for him. His Imperial Majefty has made Don Livio a Prince of the Empire.

Venice, Sept. 17. On the 15th Initant a great Convoy parted from hence for the Levant. By a Veffel come from our Fleet, we hear, that the Procurator Lorenzo Venier, going to view the Ground, in order to raife a new Battery against Napoli di Malvafia, he and two Knights of Malta were killed by a Shot from the Town, and Signior Cornaro escaped very narrowly. We have advice, that the Algerines have lately taken 13 French Ships.

Geneva, Sept. 16. We are affured, that the Vaudois having forced the Paffage which was guarded by feveral French Troops under the Command of the Marquis de Larre, are fafely arrived in the Valleys, that their number is already increased to 4000, and that more daily flock to them.

Warfaw, Sept. 2. We told you in our laft, that the Grown-General was gone with a ftrong Derachement of Horfe and Foot, to attack a Body of Tartars that lay near Cashinnee, but we underfland fince that this was only given out to cover the defign he had formed to furprife that place. Several Deferters had informed him, that it might eatily be done about midnight; but the Guides that conducted the Troops miftaking their way, it fo fell out that they arrived not before the place till towards break of day, when being diffeovered by the Enemy juft as they were going to feale the Walls, they were obliged by their great and finali Shot to retire two or 3 miles from the Town. The General had ordered the relf of the Army to advance that way, and intended to raife two Forts to hinder the Incurtions of that Garifon.

Vienna, Sept. 18. We have an account, by Letters of the 10th Inftant, from the Army commanded by Prince Loun of Baden, that there came on the 6th two Rafcians into the Camp, who reported, that the Seraskier was retired to Niffa, where he endeavoured to draw together the feattered Remains of his Army; That he had fent Orders to Teckeley; and to the Baffa of Bofnia, to join him with the Troops they had with them, and that the Enemy gave out, that the Grand Vilfer was on his march towards Niffa. The Imperial Army continued in the mean time encamped near the Moraua, and had raifed feveral Redoubts to fecure the paffage of that River.

Stratburg, Sept. 21. The French Garifon that marched out of Mentz, is arrived at Landaw; where the Count de Monclar has now the chief Command. The Duke de Daras lies encamped between Landaw and Weiffenburg.

Francfort, Sept. 24... The Elector of Saxery marched on the 22d Inftant with his Forces towards the Bergfraet. The Elector of Bayaria is flill eocamped near Hydelberg; And the Count de Serini is polted with a Detachement of his Forces towards the Black Foreft. to cover the Country of Suabra The French have barat Simmeren, Schernbern, Montzingen, and other places on the River Nobe. But we hear that 500 Men of the Garifon of Philipfburg, have been defeated by the Bararians, and molt of them cut in pieces.

From the Camp before Bon, Sept. 27. On the 23d the Elector of Brandenburg lent to the Count d'Alifelt, Governor of Bon, to know for the latt time, whether he would accept of the Conditions that had been offered him, but his Anfwer was the fame he had given fome days before. The 24th the Duke of Lorraine arrived with the Imperial Cavalry, and was Entertained the next day by his Electoral Highnets at his Quarters on the Kruy/ b vg. The 25th, a Deferter reported, that the night before two Captains and 15 Soldiers were killed in the Town; and that the Gariford grew difcontented by reafon of their being put upon Duty every other day. The 26th a Detachement of the Troops of Hansar, and the Landtgrave of Heffe-Caffel, arrived in the Camp; The Succers that are come to us from Meniz, amount to 11000 Foot, and 4050 Horfe. They have brought with them 20 Pieces of Cannon : And on whole Artillery now confifts of 250 Pieces, belides Mortars. We have fince our latt carried on bur Works with good fucces, and our new Batterlies are almost finished. The Duke of Hansar, and the Landtgrave of Heffe-Caffel, are expected here in few days.

The Marquis de Boufflers repailed the Molelle the 17th Inftant with the French Forces under his Command at Taarbach, and is now moving towards Saar Louis from whence, as we are told, he will continue this march in order to join the Duke of Duras, who they fay, is coming down again towards Philipping The French have burnt to Towns more in the Hele lectorate of Trier, and continue to wafte and defined the Country wherever they come:

Bruffels, Sept. 25.
