MY LORD, *November 30, 1880.*

IN continuation of my Despatch No. 101 of the 23rd instant, I have the honour to inform your Lordship that the following casualties in the Colonial Forces have since been reported, viz:—

On the 20th, Mr. Saunders, Commandant, Basuto Police, killed at Leribe.

On the 22nd, Private Ebdon, D.E.O.V. Rifles, wounded in foot at Mafeteng.

Two men, Ferreira and Olsen, woodcutters, have also been reported murdered at Isomo Drift on the 22nd instant.

WHEREAS by an Order of the High Court of Justice, Chancery Division, made in the matter of *ex parte* the Undertaking of the Ely and Bury St. Edmunds (Light) Railway Act, 1875; and of the Ely and Bury St. Edmunds (Railway) Abandonment Act, 1880; and in the matter of the Act 9 and 10 Victoria, cap. 20, intitled an Act to amend an Act of the second year of Her present Majesty for providing for the custody of certain moneys paid in pursuance of the Standing Orders of Parliament by subscribers to works and undertakings to be effected under the authority of Parliament, the following inquiries were directed, that is to say:—1.
