THE FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1881.

A^T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 3rd day of January, 1881.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

PRESENT:

Lord President. Mr. Mundella.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1878,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order may be cited as The Footand-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1881.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall operate notwithstanding anything in The Animals Order; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

3. This Order operates in and in relation to all areas for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease in England or Wales or Scotland, but not elsewhere.

Markets, Fairs, Exhibitions, and Public Sales in Infected Areas.

4. No market, fair, exhibition, or sale by public auction or other public sale of animals (whether or not being fat animals intended for slaughter) shall be held in an area infected with foot-andmouth disease, except as authorized by or under this Order. 5. Markets, fairs, exhibitions, and sales by public auction or other public sales for the sale or exhibition of fat animals intended for slaughter may be held in an area infected with foot-andmouth disease, with the licence of the Local Authority, on the following conditions; and every such licence shall specify the following as the conditions on which the licence is granted (namely): (α .) Cattle exposed for sale or exhibited in a

- (a.) Cattle exposed for sale or exhibited in a market, fair, exhibition, or sale so licensed shall be marked by the owner, consignee, or other person exposing or exhibiting the cattle, at his own expense, by clipping a broad arrow, about five inches long, on the left hind quarter of each of them.
- (6.) Animals so exposed for sale or exhibited shall be slaughtered within six days after such exposure or exhibition.
- (c.) Animals so exposed or exhibited shall not be afterwards exposed or exhibited in or at any other market, fair, exhibition, sale by public auction or other public sale of animals.
- (d.) Animals so exposed for sale shall not be moved alive out of the infected area.

6. If the Privy Council are of opinion on inquiry, with respect to any licence granted by a Local Authority under this Order, that the holding of the market, fair, exhibition, or sale thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

7. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions and in addition thereto, markets, fairs, exhibitions, and sales by public auction or other public sales of animals (whether or not being fat animals intended for slaughter) may be held with the licence of the Privy Council.

8. Nothing in the foregoing provisions shall be deemed to interfere with, or make a licence (either of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority) necessary for, a sale of animals being on a farm or premises not in a place infected with foot-andmouth disease, in case the animals are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have been on the farm or premises not less than twenty-eight days immediately before the sale.

Movement in or into or out of Infected Areas.

9.—(a.) Animals not affected with foot-andmouth disease may be moved in or into or out of such parts of an area infected with foot-andmouth disease as are not comprised in a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease, in accordance with the following Regulations, and not otherwise:

A.—Movement in.

(i.) The animals may be moved in those parts of the area with a licence of the Local Authority, on a certificate of a Veterinary Inspector certifying that the animals to be moved are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not, to the best of his knowledge and belief, been exposed to the infection of foot-and-mouth disease, or on a declaration such as is indicated in Form A in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect, made by the owner of the animals described in the declaration, or by his agent authorized in writing for that purpose.

(ii.) The animals may be moved in those parts of the area from one part of a farm or of farms in the same occupation to another part of that farm or of those farms, or from and to a farm or premises to and from a common or grazing-land which the occupier of the farm or premises is entitled to use for the animals, with a licence of the Local Authority (to be called an Occupation Licence) such as is indicated in Form B in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect, on a certificate or declaration as aforesaid; which Occupation Licence may authorize the movement from time to time of those animals for a period of fourteen days and no longer.

B. - Movement into.

(iii.) The animals may be moved into those parts of the area with a licence of the Local Authority, on a certificate or declaration as aforesaid.

C.-Movement into, from another District.

(iv.) If the animals to be moved into those parts of the area, under Regulation B, are to be moved out of the district of another Local Authority, whether that district is within the area or not, the licence must be a licence of the Local Authority out of whose district the animals are to be moved; and there must also be a licence of the Local Authority into whose district the animals are to be moved, indorsed on or referring to the first-mentioned licence; which second licence must be obtained before the animals are so moved.

D.-Movement out.

- (v.) The animals may be moved out of those parts of the area with a licence of the Local Authority, on a certificate or declaration as aforesaid.
- (vi.) The licence shall specify the place to which, and the person to whom, the animals are to be moved.
- (vii.) The animals, after they are received at the they are suitable, and with the requise place specified in the licence, shall not be tions, for the purposes of this Order.

E. - Movement out, into another District.

- (viii.) If the animals are to be moved into the district of another Local Authority under Regulation D, there must also be a licence of that other Local Authority indorsed on or referring to the first-mentioned licence; which second licence must be obtained before the animals are so moved.
- (ix.) The animals, after they are received at the place specified in the licence of that other Local Authority, shall not be again moved except with a further licence of that other Local Authority.

Local Authority. (b.) Nothing in Regulation D or E shall authorize the granting of a licence by a Local Authority for the movement out of an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease of animals that have been exposed for sale or exhibited in a market, fair, exhibition, or sale licensed by a Local Authority under this Order.

(c.) Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to imply that a licence is necessary for movement of animals except where the movement is intended to be wholly or in part on a highway or thoroughfare, or on a railway, canal, river, or inland navigation.

10.—(a.) A licence granted under the last foregoing Article shall not be available except when accompanied by the certificate or declaration on which it is granted.

(b.) The person granting the licence shall, for the identification of the certificate or declaration produced to him, mark the certificate or declaration by signing his name thereon, with the date of its production to him.

(c.) The person granting the licence shall deliver the certificate or declaration with the licence to the person receiving the licence from him.

11. Where an area infected with foot-andmouth disease comprises the whole or parts of the districts of more Local Authorities than one, then, notwithstanding anything in this Order, those Local Authorities, or any two of them, may, if they think fit, agree that animals may be moved out of the district of one of those Local Authorities agreeing into the district of another of those Local Authorities agreeing, without a licence of that other Local Authority, provided that in every such case the movement is into and out of such parts only of the area as are not comprised in a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Forms.

12.—(a.) The forms given in the Schedule to this Order, with such variations as circumstances require, may be used for the purposes of this Order.

(b.) The words set forth in Form E in the Schedule to this Order, or words to the like effect, shall be printed on the back of each licence issued in Form B, C, or D in the Schedule to this Order.

(c.) Forms of declaration given in the Order of Council (No. 564) of the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, which have been before the making of this Order prepared and are already printed for use by a Local Authority, may be used, as far as they are suitable, and with the requisite adaptations, for the purposes of this Order.

Offences.

13.—(a.) If a head of cattle required by this Order, or by a licence of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority thereunder, to be marked is not so marked, the owner, consignee, or other person exposing or exhibiting the same, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(b.) If an animal required by this Order, or by a licence of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority thereunder, to be slaughtered is not so slaughtered, the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(c.) If an animal is moved in contravention of the provisions of this Order, or of a licence of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority thereunder, the owner thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the company or person moving or conveying the animal, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(d.) If an animal is sold, or exposed, or put up for sale, or exhibited, in contravention of this Order, or of a licence of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority thereunder, or if a company or person hold a market, fair, exhibition, or sale in contravention of this Order, or fail to comply with any of the conditions, provisions, or regulations of a licence for the holding of a market, fair, exhibition, or sale, the seller of the animal, and the auctioneer putting the same up for sale, and the person exposing the same for sale or exhibiting

the same, and the company or person holding the market, fair, exhibition, or sale, or so failing, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

Revocation.

14.—(a.) Articles 20 and 21 (Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease) of The Animals Order, and the Order of Council (No. 564) of the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, are, as from the commencement of this Order, hereby revoked; but nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under those Articles or Order before this Order takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Articles or Order.

(b.) As from the commencement of this Order, all the regulations relating to the holding of markets, fairs, exhibitions, or sales of animals contained in the Orders of Council declaring areas to be areas inlected with foot-and-mouth disease then in force are hereby revoked; and in lieu thereof the provisions of this Order relating to the holding of markets, fairs, exhibitions, or sales of animals shall apply to the holding of markets, fairs, exhibitions, or sales of animals within those areas; and all licences for the holding of markets, exhibitions, or sales of animals granted by the Privy Council or by a Local Authority under those Orders or any of them, in force at the commencement of this Order, are hereby revoked.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1878,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as The Metropolitan Cattle Market (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Temporary Order of 1881.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eightyone; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eightyone, except as regards the recovery of any penalty incurred thereunder before that day; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

3.—(a.) Animals exposed for sale in the Metropolitan Cattle Market, at Islington, in the Metropolis, shall not be moved out of the area of that Market (including the lairs within that area), but shall be slaughtered within that area, except as follows:

(b.) Animals may be moved out of that area to a slaughter-house in the Metropolis for the purpose of being there slaughtered :

(c.) Provided that cattle so moved shall, before they are moved, be marked by the owner, consignee, or other person exposing the cattle in that Market, at his own expense, by clipping the hair off the end of the tail of each of them.

4. Animals which have been exposed for sale in the Metropolitan Cattle Market—

(a.) shall be slaughtered within ten days after such exposure ; and

(b.) shall not during those ten days be exposed in any market other than the Metropolitan Cattle Market; and (c.) shall not during those ten days be exposed or exhibited in or at any fair, exhibition, sale by public auction or other public sale of animals in the Metropolis; and

(d.) shall not be moved alive out of the Metropolis.

5.—(a.) If a head of cattle required by this Order to be marked is not so marked, the owner, consignee, or other person exposing or exhibiting the same, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878. (b.) If an animal required by this Order to be

(b.) If an animal required by this Order to be slaughtered is not so slaughtered, the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(c.) If an animal is moved in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the company or person moving or conveying the animal, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

6. The Order of Council dated the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, relating to animals exposed for sale in the Metropolitan Cattle Market, is, as from the commencement of this Order, hereby revoked; but nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under that Order, before this Order takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, that Order.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1878,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as The Markets and Fairs Temporary Order of 1881.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eightyone; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, except as regards the recovery of any penalty incurred thereunder before that day; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

3.—(a.) This Order extends throughout England, except to—

- (i.) Foreign animals wharves in England; and
 (ii.) Areas in England for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease (for which areas provision is made, as regards markets, fairs, exhibitions, and public sales, by The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1881); and
- (iii.) The Metropolitan Cattle Market, at Islington, in the Metropolis, save so far as this Order relates to the exposure or exhibition for sale in another market of cattle marked as in this Order required (provision bring made for the Metropolitan Cattle Market by The Metropolitan Cattle Market (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Temporary Order of 1881).

(b.) This Order does not extend to Wales or Scotland.

Regulations as to Markets, Fairs, Exhibitions, and Public Sales.

4. No market, fair, exhibition, or sale by public auction or other public sale of animals (whether or not being fat animals intended for slaughter) shall be held except as authorized by or under this Order.

5. Markets, fairs, exhibitions, and sales by public auction or other public sales for the sale or exhibition of fat animals intended for slaughter may be held with the licence of the Local Authority on the following conditions; and every such licence shall specify the following as the conditions on which the licence is granted (namely):

(i.) Cattle exposed for sale or exhibited in or at a market, fair, exhibition, or sale so licensed shall be marked by the owner, consignee, or other person exposing or exhibiting the cattle, at his own expense, by clipping a broad arrow, about five inches long, on the

left hind quarter of each of them.(ii.) Animals so exposed for sale or exhibited shall be slaughtered within six days after such exposure or exhibition.

Offences.

If a head of cattle required by this Order, or by a licence of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority thereunder, to be marked is not so marked, the owner, consignee, or other person exposing or exhibiting the same, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(b.) If an animal required by this Order, or by a licence of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority thereunder, to be slaughtered is not so slaughtered, the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(c.) If an animal is moved in contravention of the provisions of this Order, or of a licence of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority thereunder, the owner thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the company or person moving or conveying the animal, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(d.) If an animal is sold, or exposed, or put up for sale, or exhibited, in contravention of this Order, or of a licence of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority thereunder, or if a company or person hold a market, fair, exhibition, or sale in contravention of this Order, or fail to comply with any of the conditions, provisions, or regulations of a licence for the holding of a market, fair, exhibition, or sale, the seller of the animal, and the auctioneer putting the same up for sale, and the person exposing the same for sale or exhibiting the same, and the company or person holding the market, fair, exhibition, or sale, or so failing, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.
