

**The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.**

In the County Court of Yorkshire, holden at Kingston-upon-Hull.

In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against William Dunham, of Preston-in-Holderness, in the East Riding of the county of York, Grocer and General Provision Dealer.

UPON the hearing of this Petition this day, and upon proof satisfactory to the Court of the debt of the Petitioner, and of the trading, and of the act or acts of the Bankruptcy alleged to have been committed by the said William Dunham having been given, it is ordered that the said William Dunham be, and he is hereby, adjudged bankrupt.—Given under the Seal of the Court, this 3rd day of January, 1881.
