

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Kent, holden at Rochester. In the Matter of Henry George Dean, of the Wellington Arms, Wellington-street, Milton-next-Gravesend, in the county of Kent, Tavern Keeper, a Bankrupt.
