AT the Court at *Osborne House, Isle of Wight*, the 5th day of *January*, 1881.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by the provisions contained in the third clause of your Majesty's Order in Council of the 5th of August 1875, and by Article 261 of the Regulations of 1879 for the Government of your Majesty's Naval Service we are empowered under certain conditions to promote annually twenty and, should vacancies occur, as many as twenty-five Lieutenants to the rank of Commander, and whereas the number of vacancies has not in any year enabled us to make the full number of advancements, We would humbly represent to your Majesty that it is in our opinion desirable, for the present, to make as many as twenty-five promotions in the course of the year without regard to the number of vacancies and we would therefore submit that we be empowered to advance annually as many as twenty-five Lieutenants to the rank of Commander under conditions similar to those contained in the aforesaid Order in Council and Article of the Regulations, namely, effecting such promotions by filling every vacancy and by supplementing any vacancies short of twenty-five at the end of each year, so long as a maximum number of two hundred and twenty-five Commanders be not exceeded; should there be more than twenty-five vacancies in any year the excess not to be filled up in that year provided that the List is kept up to two hundred. We would submit that the condition of the Order in Council of the 5th of August 1875 to the effect that the increase in the number of Commanders over two hundred is to be regarded as of a temporary nature be maintained, and that the provisions of the present Order be applicable to the promotions bearing date the 31st ultimo.

“We would represent to your Majesty that the Lords Commissioners of your Majesty's Treasury have expressed their concurrence in these proposals.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what

is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, made in pursuance of “The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862,” and dated the 27th day of June 1866, Her Majesty, on the application of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board, being the Harbour Trust owning and exercising jurisdiction upon the waters of the River Mersey, and in the sea channels and approaches thereto, was pleased to make certain rules set forth in the Schedule thereto concerning the Lights and Signals to be carried, and concerning the steps for avoiding collision to be taken by vessels navigating such waters :

And whereas by an Order in Council made as aforesaid, and dated the 14th day of August 1879, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the new “Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea,” contained in the First Schedule to the said Order, should come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1880, and should be substituted for and in lieu of the Regulations for preventing collisions at sea appended to the then existing Order in Council, dated the 9th day of January 1863.

And whereas by an Order in Council made as aforesaid, and dated the 24th day of March 1880, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the operation of Article 10 of the said new Regulations should be suspended until the 1st day of September 1881, and that there should be substituted therefor and in lieu thereof Article 9 of the said recited Order in Council of the 9th day of January 1863.

And whereas the said Mersey Docks and Harbour Board have applied to Her Majesty in Council to make, and have submitted for approval, certain new rules (in which are embodied, subject to certain exceptions and additions therein mentioned, the said recited new “Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea”), concerning the Lights and Signals to be carried, and concerning the steps for avoiding collision to be taken, by vessels navigating the said waters, to be substituted for and in lieu of the rules set forth in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the 27th day of June 1866 :

And whereas the new rules so submitted as aforesaid appear to be reasonable and proper :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers in Her vested by the said recited Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth hereby make the said new rules which are set forth in the Schedule hereto, and Her Majesty doth hereby direct that the same shall come into operation on the first day of February 1881, and shall be substituted for and in lieu of the rules set forth in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the 27th day of June 1866, and that from and after the said first day of February 1881, the said last-mentioned rules shall be and the same are hereby rescinded. *C. L. Peel.*

SCHEDULE.

RULES concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried, and concerning the steps for avoiding Collision to be taken, by vessels navigating the River Mersey.

1. Every vessel exceeding ten tons measurement, including river craft, while navigating, or anchored, or moored in any part of the River Mersey, shall, from and after the 1st day of February 1881, observe and obey the new "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea," as set out in the First Schedule annexed to an Order in Council made in pursuance of the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862, and dated the 14th day of August 1879, and as varied and amended by an Order in Council made as aforesaid, and dated the 24th day of March 1880, with the exceptions and additions mentioned in the following rules.

2. Canal flats and all other vessels without masts, whilst being towed, shall carry the lights prescribed for sailing vessels by Article 6 of the said "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea."

3. In addition to the lights for a steam vessel towing another vessel, prescribed by Article 4 of the said Regulations, such steam vessel shall carry a bright White Light showing astern as a guiding light to the vessel or vessels being towed.

4. Instead of the light prescribed by Article 8 of the said Regulations, every vessel when at anchor in the River Mersey shall carry two White Lights in globular lanterns of not less than eight inches in diameter, and so constructed as to show a clear, uniform, and unbroken light visible all round the horizon for at least one mile, one of which lights shall be placed at a height not exceeding twenty feet above the hull on the forestay, or otherwise near the bow where it may best be seen, and the other at the main or mizen peak, or on the boom topping lift, or other position near the stern, at double the height of the bow light before mentioned.

5. Instead of the light prescribed by Article 11 of the said Regulations, a bright White Light similar to the lights mentioned in Rule 4 shall be shown continuously from the stern rail of every vessel while underway and in motion in all weathers between sunset and sunrise.

6. A vessel anchored to mark the position of a wreck or other obstruction, shall carry, in all weathers from sunset to sunrise, two bright White Lights, similar to those mentioned in Rule 4, which lights shall be placed horizontally on a cross yard on the foremast, at a height not exceeding twenty feet above the hull and twenty feet apart. And the said vessel shall carry, in all weathers, between sunrise and sunset, two black balls placed as hereinbefore ordered with regard to the lights aforesaid.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the second day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the income of the rectory of the parish of Saint Botolph Bishopsgate in the city of London and in the diocese of London between that benefice and the rectory of the parish of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields, in the county of Middlesex and in the said diocese of London, and also for apportioning the income of the rectory of Saint Catherine Coleman, Fenchurch-street, in the said city of London between that benefice and the said benefice of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields in the said county of Middlesex.

"Whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of London is the patron in right of his See of the said benefice and rectory of Saint Botolph Bishopsgate and also of the said benefice and rectory of Saint Catherine Coleman Fenchurch-street and also of the said benefice and rectory of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields, in the said county of Middlesex.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that each of the said two benefices of Saint Botolph Bishopsgate and Saint Catherine Coleman, Fenchurch-street is at present more than competently endowed, and that the said benefice of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields in the said county of Middlesex is at present insufficiently endowed.

"And whereas the Right Honourable and the Right Reverend John now Bishop of the said diocese of London has represented to us, and we are of opinion that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the said parish of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields in the said county of Middlesex by means of that apportionment of the income of each of the said two benefices of Saint Botolph Bishopsgate and Saint Catherine Coleman Fenchurch-street, both in the said city of London, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

And whereas each of the said two benefices of Saint Botolph Bishopsgate and Saint Catherine Coleman Fenchurch-street is now full of a Clerk.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Archbishop of Canterbury acting as Archbishop of the Province within which each of the said two benefices of Saint Botolph Bishopsgate and Saint Catherine Coleman Fenchurch-street is situate and within which also the said benefice of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields, is situated, and with the consent of the said John Bishop of the said diocese of London acting as such Bishop and also the patron in right of his See of each of the said three benefices as aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed this scheme) and sealed the same with their respective episcopal seals.

"We the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day of the date at which the said benefice and rectory of Saint Botolph Bishopsgate in the said city of London shall from whatsoever cause be next avoided all the endowments whatsoever or wheresoever now belonging or which may hereafter belong to the said benefice and rectory of Saint Botolph Bishopsgate shall be chargeable and be for ever thereafter charged in favour of the rector or incumbent for the time being of the said benefice and rectory of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields in the said county of Middlesex with one clear annual sum or yearly charge of three hundred pounds the same annual sum or yearly charge of three hundred pounds to be as from the day aforesaid due and payable to the rector or incumbent of the said benefice and rectory of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields and to be apportionable between any outgoing rector or incumbent of the benefice and rectory of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields or his representatives and his successor in the same benefice and rectory, and to be receivable by each such rector or incumbent by equal half yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year the first of such half yearly payments to be made on that one of the said two days (namely the first day of May and the first day of November) which shall come next after the completion of six calendar months from the next avoidance as aforesaid of the said benefice and rectory of Saint Botolph Bishopsgate in the said city of London but so nevertheless that if such avoidance shall happen on any day of the year other than the first of May or the first of November, the rector or incumbent of the said benefice and rectory of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields in the said county of Middlesex shall on the first day of May or (as the case may be) on the first day of November which shall come next after such avoidance be entitled to receive in respect of the said annual sum or yearly charge of three hundred pounds a sum proportioned to the period which shall have elapsed between such avoidance and that one of the said two days which shall come next after the same avoidance.

"And we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further recommend and propose with the like consents testified as aforesaid that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than as aforesaid and as from the day of the date at which the said benefice and rectory of Saint Catherine Coleman, Fenchurch-street, in the said city of London shall from whatsoever cause be next avoided all the endowments whatsoever or wheresoever now belonging or which may belong to the said benefice and rectory of Saint Catherine Coleman Fenchurch-street shall be chargeable and be for ever thereafter charged in favour of the rector or incumbent for the time being of the said benefice and rectory of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields in the said county of Middlesex with one clear annual sum or yearly charge of one hundred pounds the same annual sum or yearly charge of one hundred pounds to be as from the day last aforesaid due and payable to the rector or incumbent of the said benefice and rectory of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields and to be apportionable between any outgoing rector or incumbent of the benefice and rectory of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields or his representatives and his successor in the same benefice and rectory and to be receivable by each such rector or incumbent by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year the same

last-mentioned half-yearly payments to commence and be payable in manner and upon the dates hereinbefore recommended and proposed with respect to the said proposed charge of three hundred pounds per annum upon the said benefice and rectory of Saint Botolph Bishopsgate in the said city of London.

"And we further recommend and propose that the rector or incumbent for the time being of the said benefice and rectory of Saint Giles-in-the-Fields in the said county of Middlesex shall have the following powers for recovering each of the said two annual sums or yearly charges of three hundred pounds and one hundred pounds respectively so as aforesaid proposed to be charged upon the said benefice and rectory of Saint Botolph Bishopsgate in the said city of London, and upon the said benefice and rectory of Saint Catherine Coleman Fenchurch-street in the same city respectively that is to say, power if and whenever any part of the said annual sum or yearly charge of three hundred pounds or (as the case may be) of the said annual sum or yearly charge of one hundred pounds shall at any time be unpaid for twenty-one days after any of the times hereinbefore appointed for the payment thereof (although there shall not have been any legal demand made thereof) to enter into the receipt of the endowments charged therewith or any part thereof and to receive and take the same until he shall thereby or otherwise be paid and satisfied the same rent-charge and the arrears thereof due at the time of such entry or afterwards to become due during his being in possession of the same premises together with all costs and expenses occasioned by non-payment thereof and for the purpose of collecting receiving and recovering such endowments or any of them to use exercise and enjoy all such powers and remedies for collecting recovering and enforcing payment thereof, as may at the time be vested in the rector or incumbent of the said benefice and rectory of St. Botolph Bishopsgate in the said city of London or (as the case may be) in the rector or incumbent of the said benefice and rectory of Saint Catherine Coleman Fenchurch-street in the same city.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Paul Kingston Hill being:—

"All that part of the new parish of Norbiton in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester which is bounded on the north by the district parish of Ham and on the west by the parish of Kingston-upon-Thames both in the county and diocese aforesaid and on the remaining sides that is to say on the south and on the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Kingston-upon-Thames from the new parish of Norbiton aforesaid at the centre of the bridge which carries the Kingston Line of the London and South-Western Railway over the Upper Richmond-road such bridge being at the eastern end of the new Kingston Station on the said line of railway and extending thence that is from the said boundary eastward along the middle of the same line of railway for a distance of forty-two and a half chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge near the foot of Kingston Hill which carries the said line of line of railway over the London-road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of seventy-four and a half chains or thereabouts to the boundary on the top of Kingston Hill aforesaid a little to the south of the mile-stone situate on the eastern side of the same road and indicating a distance of ten and a half miles from Whitehall and of eleven miles from the Royal Exchange which last-mentioned boundary divides the said new parish of Norbiton from the district parish of Ham aforesaid."

"And with the like consent of the said John Charles Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Athanasius situate at Kirkdale as aforesaid and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being Provided always that so long as the Reverend Thomas Hornby Clerk in Holy Orders the present vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Walton-on-the-Hill shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication solemnization or performance at the said church of Saint Athanasius situate at Kirkdale as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Thomas Hornby and provided also that if the Reverend Thomas Major Lester the present incumbent of the perpetual curacy of the said district chapelry of Saint Mary Kirkdale, shall continue to be such incumbent at the date of the next avoidance of the vicarage of the said parish of Walton-on-the-Hill then and thereafter, so long as he the said Thomas Major Lester shall remain incumbent of the same perpetual curacy, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication solemnization or performance at the said church of Saint Athanasius situate at Kirkdale as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Thomas Major Lester and provided further that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to

concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Athanasius Kirkdale being:—

"All that portion of the district chapelry of Saint Mary Kirkdale some time part of the parish of Walton-on-the-Hill in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Liverpool which is bounded on the west partly by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Paul North Shore and partly by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Aidan Liverpool both in the county of Chester and in the said diocese of Liverpool and which said portion of such district chapelry is bounded on all other sides that is to say upon the south upon the east and upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Aidan Liverpool from the district chapelry of Saint Mary Kirkdale aforesaid at the point where Stanley-road is intersected by Great Mersey-street and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with Smith-street and extending thence first northward and thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Westminster-road and continuing thence still north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bradwell-street, Liver-crescent and Orwell-road and extending thence first westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to the point where it is intersected by Sessions-road and extending thence north-westward along the course of the intended extension of Orwell-road aforesaid for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to a point on the boundary in the middle of Stanley-road aforesaid which divides the said district chapelry of Saint Mary Kirkdale from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Paul North Shore aforesaid, such point being situate at or near to the union of Stanley-road Melrose-road and Commercial-road."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Liverpool.

In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of only so many relatives of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents, children, brothers and sisters, as can be buried at or below that depth.

ST. JAMES', WEDNESBURY.—Forthwith wholly in the parish church of St. James', Wednesbury, in the county of Stafford; and in the churchyard, except as follows:—

In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(c.) For payment by the lessees of the rent and all rates, taxes, and assessments (except landlord's property tax).

(e.) That all carriage houses must be in situations approved by the lessors.

(f.) For compliance by the lessees with all parliamentary enactments.

(g.) For the carriages to be constructed and maintained and run at such speed as the lessors may approve.

(h.) For the carriages to be run daily, at intervals of not more than one hour, between 6 A.M. and 10 P.M., except on Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday, when this condition will not be obligatory.

(i.) For the prevention of the affixing of objectionable placards to the carriages.

(j.) That the lessors may make bye-laws with reference to the working or use of the tramways.

(k.) For the observance by the lessees of all bye-laws made by the lessors.

(l.) For the maintenance in good condition by the lessees of the carriages, horses, and harness to be used on the tramways.
