WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of a house and premises, comprising one thousand two hundred and seventy eight square yards or thereabouts, which have been permanently secured to the vicarage or benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Little Hulton, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said vicarage or benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Little Hulton, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one yearly sum or stipend of fifty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November, in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our

opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage or benefice, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our common seal, this tenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.
