WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of a sum of five hundred pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the vicarage of Acomb, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said vicarage of Acomb, to meet such benefaction, one other capital sum of five hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Acomb.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage or benefice of Saint Paul, Thornton Heath, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Canterbury, one yearly sum or stipend of sixty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and to be receivable in four equal portions, on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that the annual sum or stipend so granted by us to the Incumbent of the said vicarage or benefice shall be in addition to the yearly sum or stipend of like amount heretofore payable by us, the said Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said vicarage or benefice, subject to certain conditions under the authority of another instrument sealed by us on the ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and published in the London Gazette of the seventeenth day of the same month and year: And provided also, that the said two yearly sums or stipends of sixty pounds each shall be paid only upon the production to us, on or after each of the four above-mentioned days in each and every year, of a certi-

ficate under the hand of the Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield, that an Assistant-Curate, duly licensed by such Bishop, has been employed within the parish of Saint Paul, Thornton Heath aforesaid, during the quarter of the year then ended; and is in receipt of a salary after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum: Provided also, that such yearly sum or stipend shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the said parish and vicarage or benefice of Saint Paul, Thornton Heath.

INSTRUMENT of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, substituting the New Church of All Saints, for the Old Church of Saint James within the Parish of Duddo, in the County of Northumberland, and Diocese of Durham.

To all to whom these presents shall come, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, send greeting:

WHEREAS a new church has lately been built within the parish of Duddo, in the county of Northumberland, and in the diocese of Durham, and has been consecrated and dedicated to All Saints.
