INCOME TAX.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of two hundred pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the vicarage of All Saints, Childs Hill, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said vicarage of All Saints, Childs Hill, to meet such benefaction, one other capital sum of two hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of improving the parsonage or house of residence belonging to the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of All Saints, Childs Hill.
