“ That the vicar of Stogursey for the time being shall not hereafter be liable to repair or contribute to the repair of the chancel of the said church or chapel of Lilstock but with this exception the vicar of Stogursey for the time being shall remain subject to all such liabilities as he would have been liable to if the scheme hereby proposed had not been carried into effect.

“ That the vicar of Kilton for the time being shall hereafter be liable to repair the chancel of the said church or chapel of Lilstock.

“ That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments (if any) for churchings marriages burials and ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the said parish of Kilton in respect of any inhabitants who may reside within the limits of the said chapelry of Lilstock shall belong to the incumbent clerk and sexton of the said parish of Kilton.

“ That the owners and occupiers of any lands and hereditaments within the limits of the said chapelry of Lilstock shall not hereafter be liable to contribute to the maintenance and repair of the parish church of Stogursey or to the expenses incidental to the due performance of Divine service therein but shall be so liable (subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act 1868) for or in respect of the said parish church of Kilton.

“ That the owners and occupiers of lands and hereditaments within the limits of the said chapelry of Lilstock shall not hereafter be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Stogursey but shall be entitled in common with the parishioners of Kilton to accommodation in the

church of Kilton and in the church or chapel of Lilstock.”
